At Corowa High School we are incredibly blessed to be part of a school community where sport is such an integral part of our students' lives. Our students reap the benefits of this through the development of a life-long commitment to leading fit and healthy lives and our school benefits through the obvious talents that are on display when we compete against other schools in sporting competitions. Much of the kudos for our students' successes must, therefore, go to the local sporting clubs and coaches who have spent countless hours fostering this love of sport and the talents of our students.

In the first five weeks of this term alone we have seen incredible success for our students in various sports including:

- •The Davidson Shield open boys' cricket competition where Corowa High has won the first two rounds against Deniliquin and Finley and now will progress to the third round on the 13th March;


