CHS Girls victorious in Marie Cornish Shield



The Corowa High School Girls Cricket team has opened their 2025 Marie Cornish Shield campaign with a strong win over Billabong High in the first round, chasing down a competitive total in style to secure an eight-wicket victory.

Billabong High batted first and posted a solid 6/145 from their 20 overs - with one of their batters delivering a 90-run masterclass that threatened to take the game away. However, Corowa's bowlers stuck to their task and were backed up by a committed fielding display.

Ash, making her debut behind the stumps, impressed early with a sharp catch to kick-start the innings. Addy, Mylee, Kate and Poppy all delivered tidy spells, keeping the pressure on throughout. Lilyana played a key role with the ball, claiming two crucial wickets from her six overs. But the standout was debut captain Cammy, who led by example with a sensational 4/9 off six overs, earning her early consideration for player of the match.

Chasing 146 for victory, Corowa's innings began with real purpose. Addy looked in ominous touch, hitting the ball cleanly before being dismissed in unfortunate fashion—her well-timed pull shot lodging awkwardly in a fielder's elbow.

Mylee, under the watchful eye of her sister on the sideline, showed grit in her batting debut, partnering well with the aggressive Lilyana, whose quickfire 20 included four cracking boundaries. After both fell in quick succession, the game hung in the balance.

Enter Cammy and Poppy. With 90 still needed, the pair put on a batting clinic, running smartly between the wickets and punishing anything loose. Poppy's calm and confident 32 not out was impressive, but it was Cammy again who stole the show. Her unbeaten 41 with the bat sealed the win and capped off a superb all-round performance.

An excellent team effort, this win sets a strong tone for the rest of the campaign. Well done girls!

NSW Public Schools Student Survey

Bus Route Reminder

Look for the Route Number, Not the Fleet Number

We've noticed some confusion around school bus identification.

Please remember: students should identify their bus by the Route Number

— not the fleet number on the vehicle.

The correct Route Number is always clearly displayed in the front window. For example, although Route S780 might be driven by Bus 9, students should still look for and refer to S780 only.

This Route Number is also what's printed on student bus passes, and it's the number parents, guardians, and students should always use when referring to a bus.


