TOM State Final



Tournament of Minds is a creative problem-solving competition. On 31 August our team went to the Riverina District Tournament. They placed first in their division which qualified them to compete at the State Finals which were held on 13-15 September.

At the State Finals in Sydney, the team was given a problem and had just three hours to solve it. They also had to solve a mystery problem in just 4 minutes.

Our team was awarded Honours at State Finals which is a big achievement competing against winning schools from across the state.

Beyond the competition, we had the chance to explore the Sydney CBD.



All students in Year 9 participate in the Science PBL challenge to design and build an earthquake-proof structure within a set budget. Materials are restricted and students must only choose from the list provided. Working in groups, they researched structures throughout the world that have been built to withstand earthquakes. Then, using that knowledge, they designed and built a tower using a 'champion structure' such as dampeners, side curtains or base isolators. Structures were tested on a shake table and then the results were analysed, and a final evaluation was completed. They then had to present their structure and findings to the class. On the day of their presentation in the library, students not involved were encouraged to vote for their favourite structure. Group 7 were the winning group.

Year 8 Sport Studies completed the Rutherglan Bike loop today, riding to Rutherglen via Lake Moodemere and back to Corowa. Our riders faced some uphill battles but enjoyed the speed thrill ride down the other side.
