This term, our talented Year 11 Multimedia students have been introduced to the world of graphic design through the powerful software, Affinity Designer 2. As they begin to explore the field, students are learning how to navigate the interface and harness the tools that bring their creative ideas to life.

Affinity Designer 2 is a professional vector graphic design program that allows students to create clean, scalable artwork. They've been learning to use essential tools such as the Pen Tool for precise shape and line creation, the Node Tool for editing curves and anchor points, the Shape Tool to quickly build geometric designs, and the Fill and Gradient Tools to add depth and dimension. These tools help students bring a digital polish to their sketches and concepts.

Alongside mastering the software, students have been developing a strong understanding of the elements and principles of design. They've explored concepts such as colour, line, shape, balance, contrast, and alignment—all crucial for creating visually appealing and effective designs.






To put their learning into practice, students have completed two engaging skill-building tasks.

The first was the Polygon Animal task. Students selected an animal and transformed it into a low-poly artwork using the Pen Tool. They then chose a harmonious colour palette to fill in each shape, focusing on tonal variation and visual unity.





MATHS WEBSITE FOR THE HOLIDAYS





A captivating fantasy novel set in a world where books hold the key to life and death, exploring the power of storytelling and the magic of creation through rich world-building and compelling characters.




A practical and accessible guide to managing personal finances and achieving financial independence.

What do you prefer: books or games?


If I'm being honest, I would say games. However, books are always a great choice too.
