








Public Speaking Competition

Students have worked hard in class to prepare a short speech on an open-ended topic to be presented in front of their class. Students will be judged according to set criteria. The marking rubric will be shared with students. Consideration will be given to manner - how students speak, and matter - what is being said. A warning bell will sound as students approach their time limit. Two bells will sound when students reach their time limit. Students are not permitted to use any props, costumes, or audio-visual equipment to support their speech. Nor are they to be assisted by another person. Class speeches will begin from Week 6 and all students should be prepared to present their speech from 25 August 2025. As these class speeches are run, each class will choose students to attend the stage finals. The number of students from each class progressing to the stage finals are as follows:

- K Gurawara 4 students
- 1/2 Buru 3 students
- 1/2 Gulung 3 students
- 2/3 Gari 3 students

- 4 Garilwa 3 students
- 4/5 Mariyang 3 students
- 6 Ungah 3 students

These students will then make up the stage finals as follows;

- Early Stage 1 final 4 students total (4 students from K Gurawara)
- Stage 1 final 6 students total (3 students from 1/2 Buru and 3 students from 1/2 Gulung)
- Stage 2 final 6 students total (3 students from 2/3 Gari and 3 students from 4 Garilwa)
- Stage 1 final 6 students total (3 students from 4/5 Mariyang and 3 students from 6 Ungah)

Family members of the students who make the stage finals will be sent an invitation to attend. The stage finals will take place on Friday 12 September 2025 and will have guest adjudicators from Warrawong High School.



will be a gift; for example; birthday and you don't want your child to see the order, you are now able to tick a box in the online ordering system and the school will receive this separately and you can collect it from the office.


Students who have a BookClub voucher from the Gotcha Shop can hand in their order to the office. Parents, caregivers and grandparents are also able to order online through Book Club.


You can continue adding more siblings by clicking on the Add New Child Button and repeating this step.

Healthy School Canteen

The Cringila Public School canteen will be open as of next Monday 10 February 2025. The canteen is open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. \$6 or \$8 meal deals are available for purchase (50c extra for milk).

Thank you to the parents who have volunteered to work in our canteen in the past. We are currently in the process of organising a new roster for 2025. It will operate solely by volunteers who assist in the canteen from 9:00am until 11:20am.

Students enjoy seeing family members in the canteen and our whole school benefits from this service. Volunteers can assist on a daily, weekly, fortnightly or monthly basis and are required to do the following:

- Collect, sort orders and count the money
- Heat frozen meals
- Stock fridge with drinks

- Inform office staff of what needs to be reordered
- Put drinks and meals on class trays
- Wash oven trays
- Hand out lunches from canteen

There are usually between 40 - 60 orders daily and there is no food preparation involved.

If you are able to assist in the canteen please contact the office. We realise that parents have commitments and are only available on certain days. In 2025, canteen opening days will be Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Thank you for your support and we appreciate your help.

Cringila Public School Project update | August 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Following the project update issued in May 2025, which is also shared below, we would like to provide an update on the remediation project.

Due to recent wet weather, the finish date of the work has been delayed. We now expect remediation will be finished by the end of September 2025.

Thank you for your patience during this important work.

Following our <u>April 2025 works notification</u> and information session, the remediation project at Cringila Public School began on Monday 5 May 2025.

Since work has started, we have finished the establishment of the worksite such as the installation of a decontamination unit and personal protective equipment safety station. Machinery has been delivered and a new boundary fence wrapped in hessian and plastic has been installed.

We are now undertaking landscaping works and construction of a new capping layer. The capping layer will be used as a barrier to prevent oxygen reaching the coal wash.

The capping layer will be compiled of a number of materials including a bentonite blanket (geosynthetic clay liner) to provide the sealing layer, a clay cap and finally top-soil and turf.

Next steps

During June 2025 we will be installing new monitoring wells and constructing a gabion wall alongside the removal of identified trees.

The gabion wall will be constructed of rocks encased in wire mesh allowing for water drainage, while providing the strength needed for a retaining wall.

Work is scheduled to be finished by Friday 1 August 2025.

Air monitoring and safety

Safety is our priority. We are consistently monitoring air quality, surface and underground temperatures to ensure the area continue to meet strict standards, so that the school can continue with its normal operations.

Remediation work will be done in accordance with work health and safety laws and closely monitored by an independent environmental consultant.

All air monitoring to date across the site has returned results below the minimum detectable limit, which means it is consistent with acceptable levels in ambient air (i.e. <0.01 fibres/mL) as per SafeWork NSW guidelines. These results show that there is not a detectable level of asbestos fibres in the air in this area.

The area will remain fenced with no access for students, staff or community visitors until the remediation works are complete.

Managing construction impacts

Contractors, deliveries and machinery will mainly access the site via the school grounds and double gates on the Cringila Hills Mountain Bike Park boundary fence line. On some occasions deliveries and contractors may need to access the school grounds through the Sheffield Street entrance.


