**Public Speaking:** Last week's public speaking presentations were wonderful to hear! Staff were impressed with the students' preparation and confidence, showing great improvement from last year. **Stage 2 Camp:** Students and staff are looking forward to the Week 3 camp at Cascade Environmental Education Centre. This local camp will help prepare our Year 3 and 4 students for the longer camps in Years 5 and 6. If your child experiences travel sickness or requires medication, please speak with Mrs Wain or Emma and ensure a 'Request for Medicine to be Administered' form is completed.



**Uniform:** At our Term 3 Sharing Assembly, parents expressed a preference for the full-colour gingham dress as an optional uniform item. We will let you know when these become available. Along with the 2024 introduction of cooler fabric school shirts, the gingham dress and Crossmaglen jacket are the only uniform changes. The dress is completely optional. School shirts should be worn with blue shorts, trousers, skirts, or skorts. Students may wear bike pants underneath if they choose, though bike pants are not part of the uniform.

<u>Footwear:</u> Students should wear trainers or black school shoes daily (no Western boots please). It's important that your child can run comfortably in their shoes for morning movement and sports sessions.

<u>Jewellery and Make-up:</u> For safety and school guidelines, jewellery should be simple and minimal. Stud or small hoop earrings are permitted, but chain or dangling earrings are not allowed. Please avoid large or heavy jewellery, including necklaces, to prevent injuries during play. Additionally, make-up is not permitted at school. Thank you for your understanding and support.

**Home Reading:** Many students enjoyed attending the Principal's Afternoon Tea at the end of Term 3 as their Home Reading program reward. Students who are close to completing their Club I500 reading booklets will be invited to another Principal Afternoon Tea this term. We look forward to seeing how many will reach the Lunch at a Burger Bar reward (Club 2500booklet), and some will even achieve a \$25 movie voucher for completing the Club 3000 booklet. Please support your child to read at home on weekdays to help them progress and earn their rewards.

**Staying Safe – Bushfire season and Emergency drills:** We trust you had time to read the information sent home at the end of Term 3 about making a Bushfire Safety Plan. As the hot weather is already here, this is of utmost importance. For your information, students and staff practise different emergency drills at school each semester, which include: Evacuation drill (in the event of a bushfire, flood or fire), a Secure Alert drill (in the event of an electrical storm or a loose animal on site) or a Lock Down drill (in the event of an immediate threat to the school).

Did you know that Bottletrees hide water in their trunks? If you come to Yellow Cottage, you can see our awesome artwork! - Wynter




















## Years 3-6

## **P&C Mango Fundraiser**

After a successful fundraising event last year, we have decided to do the tasty Bowen Mango fundraiser. For our new families these mangoes are fresh from the tree up in Far North Queensland town of Bowen.

The Product – For \$30 per tray

The Mango Fundraiser only use Bowen Special Mangoes which are more formally known as Kensington Pride Mangoes. They are packed in a single layer tray, and each tray will usually have between 12 and 20 mangoes, with a total tray weight of approximately 7kg.

When you buy Mangoes from the Mango Fundraiser you know the fruit is coming directly from the farm to you. Your mangoes aren't being held for long periods in storage or ripening rooms.

They come to us green and when left out of the fridge, they ripen naturally over a 2-3 week period. One or two may ripen faster. They are great to have ready for that Christmas pavlova, summer smoothies or just to eat.

Delivery of the mangoes will be confirmed once our final order is submitted. We will aim for early December.

Orders will need to be in NO LATER than Monday 27th October 2025. Unfortunately, **NO LATE** ORDERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
