Keeping our families safe online - e-Safety



The e-Safety Commissioner website provides constructive advice and resources to support parents and carers to keep their children safe online. These include:

- Information about the age restrictions to under I6-year-olds, which comes into effect from December I0, 2025 (there are webinars parents can access about this click on Parent tab)
- Parental controls which can be used to support your family's online safety when using devices that connect to the internet, such as phones, laptops, tablets, gaming consoles and smart TVs
- Short videos with easy-to-read advice sheets and conversation starters to help you to talk with your child about online safety. They include tips to help them stay safe, and important information about what to do if something bad happens online.
- Recommendations for screen time for different ages
- · Advice on safer gaming, and
- How to set up a family tech agreement




























FrogID week is here!

It's time to get froggy!

From Friday 7 to Sunday I6 November, join thousands of people across Australia in FrogID Week — the nation's biggest frog count, hosted by the Australian Museum.

It's fun, easy and meaningful! All you need is your smartphone and the free FrogID app.


Here's how to get started:

Head outside after dark (frogs love a bit of rain!).

- Open the FrogID app and hit "Record."
- Capture the frog calls you hear croaks, bleats, barks and whistles.
- Upload your recordings and help scientists track frog species across Australia.

Every call counts! Your recordings help scientists monitor frog populations and understand how our ecosystems are responding to a changing climate.

Whether you're exploring your local creek, your backyard pond, or a nearby wetland, you'll be helping to protect Australia's amazing amphibians.
