### A note from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers

Congratulations to Elise, Fred, Evie, Victoria and Willow, who represented Crossmaglen Public School at the District Swimming Carnival in Macksville. Elise will be representing our school in Friday's Zone Carnival.

Teachers have noticed that some students seem tired during the school day. This tiredness might be because students are getting used to the school routine again. Another reason could be that they are spending too much time on screens, like phones, tablets, or computers.



The NSW Department of Health recommends no more than 2 hours/ day of screen time for children aged 5-I7. Please support your child to have healthy habits by following this advice and not allowing them to use devices before school. The raisingchildren.net.au website provides useful information on managing screentime for children aged 3-II, as well as other useful information to support families.

eSafety Learning: This week students have taken part in eSafety learning, using resources from the eSafety Commissioner. Year 3 and 4 students' took part in an online live webinar titled 'Be an eSafe kid: Back to school – pack your online safety toolkit', in which they learnt how to navigate online friendships by being respectful and responsible. Our Year 5 and 6 students' online live webinar 'Be an eSafe kid: Back to school – Truth or Trap? - Cyber marvel provided opportunities to investigate fake information and fake friendships online. Students developed critical thinking skills to identify misinformation, disinformation and fake online identities like impersonator and catfishing accounts. All eSafety learning highlights how children can stay safe and where to get help and support.

There are suggested activities for creating a Family Tech Agreement in your house, which is a set of rules about how devices, like smartphones, tablets, computers, TVs and gaming consoles are used in your home. I encourage you to take a look.

<u>Home Reading:</u> Teachers are delighted with students start to our Reading 500 Club this term. Please support your child by getting them into the habit of reading as soon as they've had a snack and before they get busy playing. Establishing this routine will ensure your excels through their reading booklets and is rewarded, maybe even reaching Morning Tea with the Principal, or lunch out at a restaurant.

Reading booklets are being checked in school Tuesdays-Fridays and students who have not had their booklet signed by an adult for the previous day's reading will be required to read for IO minutes during Lunch playtime. We understand that families are busy, particularly on weekends, which is why we are not checking reading booklets on Mondays, however, students must have their reading folders in school every day, for books to be changed. Students wishing to achieve the morning tea or lunch out will need to read on weekends.

**NAPLAN:** Students in Years 3-5 will take part in National Assessment Program—Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assessments during Weeks 7 and 8. Students will be assessed in Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy.
