

The 2025 theme is 'The Next Generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy'. Crossmaglen PS are celebrating NAIDOC this week. We will be taking part in engaging activities tomorrow for our NAIDOC Day celebrations. Activities will include: art/craft, weaving, making lemon myrtle cookies, using indigenous designs, and lemon myrtle cordial, from our home-grown lemon myrtle tree. Early next term, we will be participating in a Traditional Games session facilitated by Aboriginal Year IO students from Toormina High School, who will lead sessions with our K-6 students.
