This event in Woolgoolga will involve students from public schools from Port Macquarie to Tweed Heads and will feature a primary choir, a recorder ensemble, the Bellingen Youth Orchestra and individual solos from secondary students. 








Blue Cottage

In Stage 3 Maths, students have been looking at 3D prims and pyramids from different viewpoints and visualising cross-sections.









Green Gottage

Green Cottage learners have been working on using the compensation strategy to solve addition and subtraction problems. This involves rounding one of the numbers to the nearest ten to make mental calculations easier, then compensating for the number that was rounded. After mastering the strategy and gaining confidence, students worked with word problems to attribute the maths to realistic scenarios.
