




Congratulations to our wonderful readers who enjoyed the **Reader's Afternoon tea**.

These amazing readers have already completed the Club I500 reader booklet and are well on their way to the Principal's lunch and finishing Club 3000!





P&C Mango Fundraiser

After a successful fundraising event last year, we have decided to do the tasty Bowen Mango fundraiser. For our new families these mangoes are fresh from the tree up in Far North Queensland town of Bowen.

The Product – For \$30 per tray

The Mango Fundraiser only use Bowen Special Mangoes which are more formally known as Kensington Pride Mangoes. They are packed in a single layer tray, and each tray will usually have between 12 and 20 mangoes, with a total tray weight of approximately 7kg.

When you buy Mangoes from the Mango Fundraiser you know the fruit is coming directly from the farm to you. Your mangoes aren't being held for long periods in storage or ripening rooms.

They come to us green and when left out of the fridge, they ripen naturally over a 2-3 week period. One or two may ripen faster. They are great to have ready for that Christmas pavlova, summer smoothies or just to eat.

Delivery of the mangoes will be confirmed once our final order is submitted. We will aim for early December.

Orders will need to be in NO LATER than Monday 27th October 2025. Unfortunately, **NO LATE** ORDERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Payment can be by cash or direct deposit into the P&C Bank Account. **PLEASE DO NOT PAY VIA THE SCHOOL BYTES APP (this is not a P&C account).**
