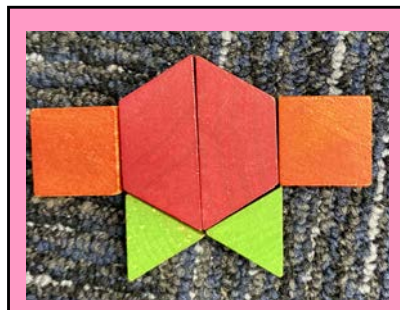
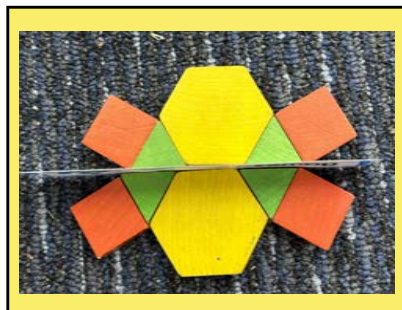
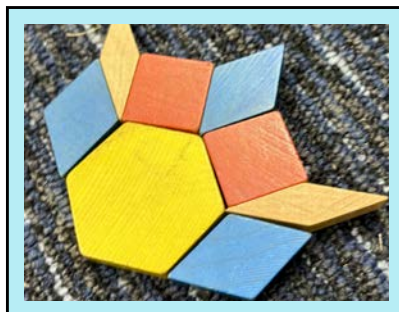
PSSA HOCKEY
