External Validation

On Tuesday, Mr Stephens and Mrs Bonner met with the External Validation Panel to share and discuss the special work taking place at our school. External Validation is a process required by the Department of Education every five years. As part of this, the school prepares a submission based on the School Excellence Framework, involving a self-assessment across the domains of Learning, Teaching, and Leading.

We are very pleased with the outcomes of this process, which recognised our strong and embedded practices in teaching, student wellbeing, curriculum offerings, and assessment. It highlighted the school's ongoing commitment to developing a high-quality learning culture.

As part of this process, the school also identified future directions and priorities, which will guide the development of our new school plan. We hope these directions will continue to support the delivery of high-quality teaching and learning here at Curra.

digraph! We are merrily blending and decoding with the addition of 'c', 'k' and 'ck'!

Over the past weeks we've looked at two books during Geography that have supported our understanding of tropical weather and seasonal patterns: 'Dry to Dry' about Kakadu's flora and fauna and 'Big Rain Coming' by Katrina Germein and Bronwyn Bancroft. In Visual Arts we have closley explored Bronwyn Bancroft's unique line drawn landscapes and we have been creating our very own interpretations of these.

We've also just completed a Maths unit on 2D shape. One of the highlights has been the opportunity to explore lines of symmetry and demonstrate our understanding using pattern blocks.





Check out our amazing ant learning wall! Our curled paper ant artworks are really unique and a sight to behold, while our informative posters all about ants are filled with fabulous facts. What's even better? We worked so well in small groups to complete them!
