

We've just started our final English unit for Term 2. We are exploring the features of narrative texts before jumping in to write and illustrate our very own imaginative stories. As part of this unit we have read 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchins and we've had our very first read of 'The Wall in the Middle of the Book' by Jon Agee.





In Maths, we have just finished our unit on Equivalence. In the last lesson of this unit, students had the chance to explore this concept in relation to mass. They read 'Who Sank the Boat' by Pamela Allen and then built their own set of scales to explore objects with a larger, smaller or similar mass. Yesterday we had our very first data lesson and really enjoyed learning the dice game 'Clear the Board'. We'll be bringing our gameboards home at the end of termhopefully our little learners will be able to teach this game to you too!
