

Staff development day - High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE)

On our first Monday back, staff continued developing our HPGE policy as it applies to our school. Every student shows areas of high potential and our emphasis is on fostering these talents while building their character through our school values. At Currabubula Public School we offer many extracurricular enrichment and extension opportunities to nurture independent successful learners, from curriculum provision to sport, music, arts and science. Our Kindy's first 4 sounds (phonemes) for Term 3 have been h, b, f & l. We've tied these into our text studies and had the chance to make some fun craft to kick of another fab term of learning.



What a busy fortnight! I was so proud of the effort, enthusiasm and skill K-2 showed at our Athletics Carnival- I'd also like to commend them on their patience during a long and busy day!



We finished our first week back by going on our Term 3 excursion to see 'Josephine Wants to Dance', presented by the Monkey Baa Theatre Company at Tamworth's Capitol Theatre. It was another excellent production with eye-catching choreography, brilliant costuming and a faithful depiction of a story we know and love. We took the opportunity to study the text in detail over Tuesday and Wednesday, completing a ballerina craftivity, writing information reports on Australian animals from the book and retelling aspects of the narrative. After the show, we walked down to the park for a play, picnic lunch and a delicious hot chocolate!

Don't miss checking out our 100 days celebration photos later in this edition of the Newsletter. Wow! What a good looking bunch of 'oldies' we are in K-2! Our excursion day happened to align with our first 100 days of school in 2025. This is a big milestone for our Kindys and one all of K-2 enjoy celebrating. In the afternoon, we worked on 100 days crowns. Each crown had to have 100 dots added. We explored ways to count efficiently to 100- settling on counting by 2s to reach 10 and then counting 10 strips of 10 dots each. Year 1 and 2 were the dot 'counters and cutters' and were excellent helpers, ensuring each student finished the day with a beautiful and accurately counted crown!

Around our classrooms: 3-6

All 3-6 students have made an enthusiastic start to what will be another busy term. We have two Spelling competitions and two debates in the coming two weeks.

Best of luck to all our students who are representing our school at the Blackville Small Schools' Spelling Bee. This is an event that is very close to my heart as I actually instigated the Spelling Bee way back when I was the principal at Blackville. I am sure everyone who attends will have a great day.

Having won their respective sections of our class spelling rounds last term, Londyn Chalmers and Logan Stocks will be competing in the Premiers' Spelling Bee on Monday, 11th August. This is an on-line competition.

On Monday, 4th August, Woolomin Public School students and staff will be visiting Currabubula for our third debate. Our team for this debate is Christopher Bradberry, Londyn Chalmers, Ryan Corr and Kallum Germon. Our team will be presenting the affirmative case for, "The school week should be four days and not five." We are very grateful to Mr Rob Lewis who has kindly offered to adjudicate for us.

On Thursday, 14th August, our final prepared debate will be an online debate against Dungowan Public School. Our team will be Kallum Germon, Amelia Smith, Logan Stocks and Londyn Chalmers. They will present the negative case against "The school week should be four days and not five."

Our English text for this term is Wonder by RJ Palacio. Students are learning to identify techniques and language features authors use to develop characterisation. 3-6 are thoroughly enjoying this text which manages to take a light- hearted and often humorous approach to a serious theme.

In Mathematics we have concluded our unit on Measurement and started a new unit, "The number system extends infinitely to very large and very small numbers."
