Our Public Speaking competition is happening again! Students will be preparing speeches AT HOME ready to deliver them to their class and teacher in weeks 3 & 4 of term 4.

Students will prepare their speeches AT HOME and bring them to school by the required date.

Although ALL students are REQUIRED to write a speech as part of their talking/listening assessment, only a handful of students from each class will present their speeches at our school assembly.

The theme for the speeches, for ALL classes is...

'MY FAVOURITE ANIMAL'

Students should include in their speech what their favourite animal is and why; is this animal helpful to humans; can it be a pet; features of the animal; where can it be found; is it extinct or endangered, etc.

Speeches will NEED to be written before they are required for assembly.
