Principal's Report: P&C Meeting August 2024

Teaching and Learning

- Stage 3 Camp

At the end of last term, our Stage 3 students embarked on camp to Bathurst (Year 5) and Canberra (Year 6). These trips are a rite of passage for our students (I'm sure those of you educated in NSW will remember your own primary school trips to Canberra and/or the gold fields) and gave them the opportunity to explore significant historical and cultural landmarks, enhancing their learning beyond the classroom. With this in mind, I would like to acknowledge the dedication and sacrifice of our wonderful Stage 3 teachers, support and executive staff who accompanied the students, ensuring their safety and well-being 24/7 for the duration of the trip. Their commitment to providing such valuable experiences is truly commendable.

Semester 1 Reports & Parent/Teacher Interviews Parent Survey

In a change to previous years, student reports were sent out to parents on Friday of Week 9 last term with Parent-Teacher Interviews held in the following week.
