# Principal's Report: P&C Meeting June 2025

## Teaching and Learning

# Assessment, Reports & Parent/Teacher Interviews

Throughout the start of this term, teachers have been engaged in a range of assessment, data analysis and moderation practices to ensure accurate and consistent judgments of student achievement across the school. Over the past fortnight, there has been a strong focus on report writing, with teachers working hard to summarise and communicate each student's progress. As we approach the end of the term, this process intensifies, with reports being edited, rewritten and refined to ensure they provide families with a clear and accurate picture of their child's learning.

Behind the scenes, improving our school-wide data collection and analysis practices has been a major focus over the last year and a half. These improvements are essential to support teachers in making informed decisions and differentiating their teaching in response to evidence of learning.

Semester 1 reports will be distributed via email on Friday 27 June (Week 9), with parent-teacher interviews scheduled for the following week and continuing into the first week of Term 3. Following the release of these reports, we will be distributing a comprehensive survey to gather parent feedback on the current format and explore any potential changes as recommended by the Department.

### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

### - Reconciliation Week

We marked Reconciliation Week across the school - a time to reflect on our shared histories, cultures and the steps we can all take toward reconciliation in Australia. While we were disappointed by the last-minute cancellation of the Koomurri incursion, our Reconciliation Week assembly was a great success. It was wonderful to see so many families join us for this important event. A highlight was our youngest students from KB, who reminded us of the importance of celebrating difference, showing understanding and respect, and what it truly means to be Australian.

As part of our ongoing commitment to our Reconciliation Action Plan, we have organised for an Aboriginal artist from the Boomalli Aboriginal Artists Co-operative in Leichhardt to run workshops with all students next term. These sessions will support students to create artworks following NAIDOC Week, further deepening their understanding and appreciation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.

A big thank you to our amazing Stage 1 team for organising today's Cross Country Carnival. Despite the overcast skies, the event ran smoothly and efficiently, with all races completed in record time and everyone back at school by 12:30!
