Year II

Welcome back to our Year 11 students who have officially commenced their HSC courses this term. This marks an exciting new chapter in their studies as they take on the challenges and opportunities of their final year at Dunedoo Central School. Alongside their academic focus, students are also busy preparing for their upcoming production number. What a big Term 4 it will be!

Yr 7/8 English

Year 7/8 English students have begun their film study unit exploring the works of renowned director Steven Spielberg. Throughout the term, they will view a selection of his iconic films and analyse how elements such as sound, camera angles and shot types contribute to meaning and emotion.

Yr II English Standard

Year 11 English Standard are studying the Common Module: Texts and Human Experiences, with their major text focus being Billy Elliot. They will explore both shared and individual human experiences represented in the film, analysing how characters, events and language features reflect the complexities of growing up and overcoming adversity.

Food Technology

Year 9/10

This term, Year 9/10 Food Technology students are studying Food in Australia. They are exploring the role of native ingredients, the impact of multicultural influences on our diets and the many factors that shape our food selection. Through practical and theory lessons, students will gain a deeper understanding of Australia's diverse food culture and how it continues to evolve.

Year 11

Year 11 Food Technology students have commenced their first HSC unit, The Australian Food Industry. This term, they are exploring the sectors of the agri-food chain and investigating the structure and operations of food companies within Australia. Students will develop an understanding of how the industry functions and its vital role in our economy and daily lives.

Yr II CAFS

Year 11 Community and Family Studies students have begun exploring Research Methodologies in preparation for their Individual Research Projects (IRPs). They are learning about a range of methods, including questionnaires, interviews, observations and case studies, as they develop and refine their own research focus questions. This work forms the foundation of their major research project in Year 12.



Mrs Douglass' classes

Year 7/8 TAS

These students have almost completed their Huckaback cushions, learning new machine skills whilst doing this. These new skills have included gathering a frill for the cushion edge, and buttons and buttonholes. Many of the students have learnt how to use the iron whilst turning over their frill edges and the precision sewing needed to stitch on the very edge of the hem fold.

They will then move on to complete an animal face mask made from felt and hand stitched together. Once these are together, the students will connect a conductive thread between light components to complete an electronic circuit. When turned on, it will light up the mask!

Year 8 PDHPE

Students will explore effective strategies for managing relationships and family dynamics. They will develop skills in self-awareness to better recognize their emotional responses in various situations. They will explore how these feelings impact their interactions, and reflect on the importance of communication and empathy in nurturing respectful relationships.

In addition, they will develop an understanding of boundaries and the significance of consent, recognizing it as a fundamental right and responsibility in all relationships. Through practical activities and discussions, students will learn to apply these concepts in both their personal and familial contexts.

Year 9 PDHPE

This unit aims to equip students with the knowledge, skills and confidence to make safe and respectful choices in a range of social, physical and online contexts. Students will explore issues such as bullying, harassment, discrimination, risk and crisis situations, and will learn practical help-seeking strategies. The unit also emphasizes cyber safety, preparing students to navigate digital environments responsibly.

Year 9/10 Textiles

These students are completing their free choice garments including shirts, dresses, hoodies and skirts.

They will now commence a project on precision patchwork. This project will test their skills in joining seams accurately. It will also allow them to use their own quilting pattern to sandwich several layers of fabric and wadding together.


Year 11 Textiles

These students are completing their corset top and moving into Year 12 work. The students will look at the historical development of textiles and fashion throughout the ages and the reasons why clothing changes happened, such as war and shortage of fabrics, cost and availability, and the Industrial Revolution.

Year 12 Textiles

These students have completed their Major Textiles projects. These projects have been sent away for marking at a central marking location and have been returned to school. The students are now in the process of completing their final HSC Exams.





Year 11


Year 11 students are finalising their Preliminary Mathematics course, looking at energy consumption and applications of rates. They have been assigned regular revision homework twice a week to consolidate their understanding of the Preliminary course in preparation for Year 12.

Year 9

Year 9 are exploring Data Analysis, with many students balancing their studies alongside extra-curricular commitments. To support those who may be away, we will be working from a booklet to help everyone stay up-to-date with classwork. Students are also encouraged to continue practising their previous topic, Indices, to prepare for their Week 5 assessment covering Indices, Statistics and Probability.

Year 7

Year 7 are building confidence in working with decimals, focusing on performing operations accurately and efficiently. Next week, they will begin a new topic on Measurement, with both topics to be assessed in Week 5. Students are encouraged to practise their skills regularly to consolidate their understanding and prepare for the final assessment.
