




Public Education Week 2025

for example stationery and art supplies, and materials for practical classes. These contributions remain the same as for 2024.



K/I LEARNING LEGENDS


With Education Week last week showcasing all the wonderful opportunities public education has to offer, I asked each of our K/1 students the following question:

Year 8 Art Update—pottery

We're excited to finish our pottery unit—students' clay pieces are now in their final firing and will soon emerge glazed, vibrant and ready to admire. Meanwhile, our class has journeyed into bold, expressive art movements. We explored Neo-Expressionism through the vivid world of Basquiat, learning about how colour, symbols and text can convey powerful messages and personal identity. We also ventured into Surrealism, inspired by Magritte's The False Mirror. By transforming a traditional eye into a cloud-filled vision, students challenged perception and created art that invites deeper reflection.



Year 7 Music Update—film music


This term, students are continuing with our film music topic. We will explore the history of film music and its functions, then learn to play a keyboard piece from a famous movie soundtrack. Students are already picking up basic keyboard skills and building confidence.



Year 8 Mathematics—rates & ratios

The Rates & Ratios unit is wrapping up this term, and it's sparked some excellent classroom conversations—especially around real-world applications like speed, recipes and shopping comparisons. These applications are vital for helping students see the mathematics around them.

In the coming weeks, students will receive an assessment task in lieu of a traditional exam. They'll have three lessons in class to complete it and are encouraged to either work on it at home or utilize our homework centre for extra support.



Year 9 Mathematics—real-world surface area and volume

This term, students are exploring how mathematics shapes our world—with a focus on length, area, surface area and volume through real-life, workplace-inspired problems. Instead of a traditional exam, students will complete a hands-on assessment task, applying mathematical concepts to practical scenarios like packaging designs, container specifications and efficient material use. Students will work on this during three class lessons, with the option to continue at home or in our Homework Centre. Through this task, they'll gain critical problem-solving experience and see firsthand how maths applies in everyday and workplace situations.





Year 7/8 Technology Mandatory







This term a new group of students are being introduced to an old form of embroidery – Huckabuck embroidery, that they will complete and then manufacture into a cushion. Students have chosen their designs and are threading their threads under the floating threads to complete the designs.

Year 8 PDHPE

This term Year 8 students will learn about growing up and entering adolescence, including the physical, social and emotional changes and challenges of puberty. Understanding these challenges and investigating questions such as "Am I normal?" can be helpful as students navigate the landscape of change.

Year 9 PDHPE

This term students in Year 9 will explore topics in relation to sexual health and their impacts, including discussions on consent, pregnancy, STIs and the significance of fostering respectful relationships throughout these discussions. The curriculum aims to equip students with knowledge essential for making informed decisions and cultivating healthy interpersonal interactions.

Year 9/10 Textiles

This term students are working on a free choice garment — with dresses, skirts, tops, shorts and shirts being manufactured. Each student is working on their individual projects learning different techniques to produce each garment. Skills being learnt range from inserting a zipper, making buttonholes and sewing on buttons, cuffs and collars and lined yokes and sewing with stretch fabrics.



Year 11 Textiles

These students have completed their manufactured pants, seeing different styles of pants created. Each student is now working towards manufacturing a corset-style top, learning about the insertion of boning into garments to create a fitted garment. They look at the history of how women wore these corsets as undergarments and how contemporary fashion sees these more relaxed garments as outerwear, such as those used in bridal, formal and "after five" bodice tops.

Year 12 Textiles

These students are working towards completing their Major Textiles Projects ready for submission in Week 5. Each student has produced an item and has almost completed their accompanying folio explaining how they have created their masterpiece and the different experiments completed to determine the production processes that followed.





- The Dental Van will be in Dunedoo for the final week of Term 3, and for the first 4 weeks of Term 4, depending on requirements.



Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- · category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.


The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
