Year 9 Production

The Year 9 production is fast approaching in Week 7, and excitement is building as students finalise their preparations. All students are reminded to begin sourcing their costumes, which consist of a long-sleeve black shirt and long black pants or tights. To ensure they feel confident and performance-ready, please encourage your child to review the dance demonstration clip available in Google Classroom. If you require any assistance with acquiring the clothing, please don't hesitate to reach out — we're more than happy to help ensure every student can take part fully.

Year 7 Music

This term in Music, Year 7 students are rocking out as they explore the impact of rock music over the past 80 years. The unit has sparked great enthusiasm, with students delving into iconic artists, styles and the evolution of the genre. They are now rehearsing for their final assessment, a "Battle of the Bands" performance where each group will cover a popular rock song of their choice. All students have successfully formed bands and are diligently practising their individual parts to bring their group's performance to life.

Year 8 Maths

Year 8 students are currently working through the Linear Relationships unit, developing their understanding of how equations and graphs connect. With the Year 8 Mathematics Exam scheduled for Week 5, it's important that students keep up to date with classwork and attend catch-up sessions if they have missed any lessons. Regularly reviewing notes, practising questions and completing assigned tasks will help consolidate their learning and ensure they are well prepared for the upcoming assessment.

Year 8 Visual Arts

Year 8 students are currently immersed in an Indigenous Art unit, exploring a range of traditional and contemporary techniques used by Indigenous artists to share stories, culture and connection to Country. Students are now completing their own artworks that tell a personal story, incorporating authentic Indigenous-inspired techniques such as dot painting, patterning and symbolic design. The results so far are looking fantastic, with students showing great focus and attention to detail as they refine the more detailed elements of their work.

This artwork was a journey telling a story about men sitting around a fire and having a yarn. They have seen a few kangaroo tracks along the roads and are keen to hunt them.

Year 9 Mathematics

This term, Year 9 students are focusing on Probability and Statistics, learning how to interpret data, calculate probabilities and make informed conclusions based on evidence. They've been developing their analytical and problem-solving skills through practical investigations and real-world examples. With the Mathematics Exam taking place in Week 5, students are encouraged to revise key concepts regularly, seek clarification when needed and stay engaged in class activities to ensure they feel confident and well prepared for the assessment.



Year 7/8 English

Students have been exploring our film unit, focusing on the work of acclaimed director Steven Spielberg. They've been uncovering the techniques filmmakers use to create emotional impact on screen — and discovering that bringing these feelings to life is truly an artform in itself.

Year 9/10 English

Students have also been exploring a unit on film focusing on the inspiring work of actor Robin Williams. They've been studying the film techniques and storytelling choices that help create mood and emotion, bringing powerful moments to life on screen.



Year 9 History

Students have been exploring a unit titled 'Making a Nation', which investigates how Australia became the nation it is today. They are currently delving into Australia's path to Federation, uncovering the reasons, challenges and achievements that defined this important chapter in our history.



Year 10 History

Year 10 students are continuing their study of the Holocaust, focusing on the concentration camps — their purpose, operation and the horrific conditions that claimed so many lives during World War II. This unit encourages students to reflect deeply on human rights, empathy and the importance of historical understanding.





Skillset Interviews

On Monday October 20th, Year 10 sat independent interviews with representatives from Skillset Mudgee. This opportunity allowed students to prepare their resume, a cover letter and answer interview questions for a chosen job in a formal setting. Congratulations to Oscar Christensen who "got the job", Brayden Stanford who was placed second and Jackson Green for his highly commended responses. Very special thanks to Nicole and Libbie for conducting the interviews!

MURHH Rural Health Careers Outreach Trip

Last Tuesday we had Macquarie University Rural Health Hub visit our school and deliver health career awareness workshops with our students in years 9-11. The session introduced students to career pathways in medicine, nursing and Allied Health through interactive, hands-on activities that simulate aspects of healthcare education. Students rotated in small groups and were offered a chance to ask questions directly to current university health students. Thanks to Rosie and the MURHH team for the fantastic opportunity they provided our students in this outreach initiative; it really inspired our students and informed those who may be considering a future in healthcare.

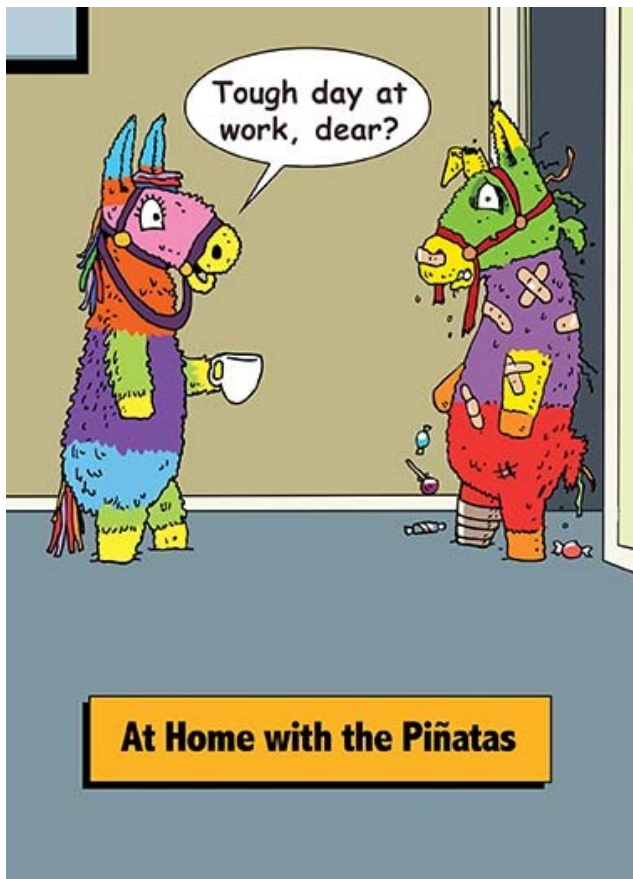
