









We have started working on our garden project. The students have weeded and turned the soil, ready to add some new soil and plants. We have planted a few agapanthus to give us something to look after in the interim.


Yr 9 &Yr 10

Science

Year 9 and 10 Science have been studying waves and electricity this term. They are currently investigating electrical circuits. Their assessment task for this term is the independent student investigation, where they conduct and report on their own investigation. Year 10 are also completing VALID this week, which is a statewide online science assessment.





Year 7/8 English

Students have been busily working on their persuasive speech writing and will be concluding this unit this week. I look forward to listening to their compositions over the coming days. They have shown great effort and should be proud of their achievements.

Year 9/10 English

Year 9/10 students have also been finalising their speeches and will present them this week. While many may feel relieved to see this unit completed, given the challenges of public speaking I am proud of the commitment they have shown in preparing for their presentations.

Year 9 History

In History, students have been examining the significant events that occurred between World War I and World War II, and are now focusing on the various factors that contributed to the outbreak of the Second World War.

Year 10 History

Students are exploring the civil rights movement in America, with particular attention on the role of Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King Jr., as well as key events such as the Montgomery Bus Boycott and the Freedom Rides.

Year 12 Aboriginal Studies

In the coming weeks, students will turn their attention to preparation for the HSC examinations. I wish them every success and have greatly valued the journey we have shared throughout the course.

Year 12 English Studies

Students have been engaging with the unit On the Road – English and the Experience of Travel. This unit explores how journeys and travel are represented in texts, and how these experiences influence identity, perspective and understanding of the world.





Year 7 French

It has been a very busy and exciting term in Year 7 French. Throughout the term, we have been delving into the rich history of France and the fascinating evolution of the French language. Students have explored significant events that have shaped France over the centuries, gaining a deeper understanding of how these historical moments continue to influence modern-day France.

Our classes have been filled with engaging discussions and activities that bring France's past to life, helping students connect language learning with cultural and historical contexts. This approach not only enhances their appreciation of the French language but also broadens their global awareness.

Last week, students received their Term 3 Assessment Task Notification, with the task due on Thursday, 25th September 2025 (Week 10). We encourage all students to start preparing early to demonstrate their understanding of the term's key themes and content.

Mono printing is a unique, one-of-a-kind printmaking technique that produces a single, distinct image from a smooth surface, such as glass, metal, or a gelatin plate. Central Schools Finals Week





























Moolarben School Spirit Awards
