PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been wonderful to see students in their full school uniforms each day. Thank you to all parents and carers for maintaining this focus at home. Please remember that black shoes are included in our uniform when you are needing to buy new shoes for your children. We maintain high expectations for students each day and have introduced a daily random name draw at recess, awarding the student with an Eagle Token if they are in full school uniform that day. Once a week we draw two Eagle Tokens out for an extra reward of play area choice with their friends and an ice block.

Congratulations to our two school leaders, who attended the Hawkesbury Leadership Camp at Brewongle last week. The first camp was on Monday and Tuesday, with our leaders attending on Thursday and Friday. Our student leaders represented our school well, participating in all the activities and mingling with other student leaders from local schools. They showed courage, resilience, respect and empathy. I could not have asked for a better representation of our school. I would like to congratulate our captains Sienna and Dilara for being wonderful ambassadors of our school.

I am happy to report that our tennis/basketball court down the back of our playground has now been repaired and is safe for students to use and play on. It has not been able to be in use so far this year, as some of the metal posts holding up the high fence had become rusted and unstable. SCHOOL BYTES

Mobile phone app - School Bytes is our main way of communicating with parents and care givers. We use this app for all newsletters, permission notes, reminders and general information notes. Additionally, we also use this mode of communication when there is a disruption to normal school routines or access – this ranges from school phone outages to bus delays. I encourage all adults who have a role in caring for our students to download the free app onto their mobile phone to ensure access to information as it arises. An email will be sent to the parent's email address provided to us at enrolment by default if you don't have the app downloaded, which can mean you miss important information in the sea of emails we all tend to receive.

School Bytes Parent Portal – there is a calendar for school events across the year available in your parent portal. It is updated regularly and is an easy way to keep up to date with upcoming school events.

HARMONY DAY

Although Harmony Day is officially on Friday 21st March, we will be **celebrating Harmony Day on THURSDAY 20 March, 2025**. Harmony Day celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. This year's theme is 'Everyone Belongs'.

Orange is the official Harmony Day colour and students are invited to wear predominantly orange clothing on this day. Students must wear appropriate footwear, a school hat and dress appropriately for the day (including covering shoulders and midriff areas).

This is a student only event, with rotating class activities after lunch, so we respectfully ask that no parents or carers are onsite at this time.

SCRIPTURE AND NON-SCRIPTURE

Our Anglican Scripture and Non-Scripture lessons have now commenced and will be held each Thursday. We have lessons for Kindergarten and Stage 1 11.30-12.00 and then Stage 2 and Stage 3 students 12.00-12.30pm. If you would like to change their group please advise the office in writing.

NAPLAN 2025

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All NSW schools will sit NAPLAN online in 2025.

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN between **12 March and 24 March, 2025**.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not recommended. Students can use the [public demonstration site](https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site) (<https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site>) to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in NAPLAN. If you have any questions about NAPLAN, please contact your child's teacher.

If you have a child in Year 3 or Year 5, please try to schedule appointments outside of the testing window above where possible. We will be using the order of assessments as stipulated by our testing authority. If your child is absent from school for an assessment, we will do our best to catch them up, however this is not always possible, especially if there have been multiple assessments missed. Below is a rough plan for assessments at our school, although these may change without notice:

Our staff are once again providing a wide variety of areas for interest groups this year – choir, technology, art/craft, gardening and chess/board games are all on offer. Students have submitted their preferences for interest groups last week. They will commence next week and run every two weeks.

TERM 1 PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Parent Teacher Interviews will be held in Week 11 this term on Tuesday 8/4/25 and Wednesday 9/4/25 after school. This is a good opportunity to check in with your child's teacher in regards to learning at school.

The 'Interviews' section in School Bytes will become active for parent bookings in Week 9 and an email will be sent to all families notifying you of this closer to the time.

Please make sure you make a booking to secure your spot. We will do ten-minute face to face interviews in the school hall. I ask that you work to keeping the interview at the ten-minute mark. We look forward to discussing your child's learning progress with you.

EXPECTATIONS AT EBENEZER

We strive to ensure all students are supported in their learning in the classroom and on the playground every day. There are numerous ways in which we promote school expectations, acknowledge students who do the right thing and remind students of negative consequences when they forget. Providing a safe and nurturing environment for all students is our ongoing focus. School staff regard parents as collaborative partners in this endeavour, and as such we ask that you are familiar with the expectations, supports and programs available:

1) All students at Ebenezer PS are expected to:

- Attend every school day, unless they are legally excused, and be in class on time and prepared to learn.
- Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform or dress code policy.
- Behave safely, considerately and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school.
- Show respect at all times for teachers, other school staff and helpers, including following class rules, speaking courteously and cooperating with instructions and learning activities.
- Treat one another with dignity and respect.
- Care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others.

2) PBL TOKENS

During class time, students are recognised when being safe; responsible; respectful or a learner by their teacher with a corresponding token. These tokens are stuck onto a token chart kept in their classroom and a full chart is exchanged for a Token Award at the next Friday assembly. These tokens are also tracked by teachers to ensure we are acknowledging and celebrating student achievements.

15 Tokens (Safe/ Responsible/ Respectful/ Learner/ Attendance/ Eagle) = 1 Token Award

3 Token Awards (45 Tokens) = Bronze Award

6 Token Awards (90 Tokens) = Silver Award

9 Token Awards (135 Tokens) = Gold Award

This system is ongoing, with the names of students who receive a Token Medallion (405 Tokens) have their name engraved on the perpetual Token Shield at the end of each year.

Gold Award recipients are also invited to a free morning tea with the Principal at the end of each semester, as further recognition of their ongoing commitment to displaying school expectations.

Additional Tokens:

- UNIFORM – Student leaders randomly draw out two student names daily at the recess assembly. If these students are in full school uniform they receive a bonus Eagle token for their Eagle draw and their Token Chart.
- ATTENDANCE – Student leaders randomly draw out two student names once a week at the recess assembly. If these students are at school that day they receive a white Attendance Token for their Token Chart.

3) EBENEZER EAGLES

The orange Ebenezer Eagle token focuses on positive behaviour in the playground. Teachers on duty before school, recess, lunch and in bus lines have these tokens to hand out to students seen following our school expectations of being respectful, responsible and safe. Students know to write their name on the token and put it in our Ebenezer Eagle Token Tub. Each week two names will be drawn out of the tub

for a reward: a free ice block (or substitute) and the choice of a playground area for themselves and nine friends for the next play period.

After two names have been drawn out, all Ebenezer Eagle tokens for the week will be sorted into their classes by our terrific SRC students and these tokens will be added to each individual token chart in the classrooms.

4) AIM HIGH CHARTS, BEHAVIOUR RECORDINGS AND FURTHER CONSEQUENCES

Students who choose not to display behaviour that is aligned to our school expectations are reminded of these with a number of strategies. All classrooms have an Aim High Chart, ranging from positive behaviour acknowledgements (Learner, Good, Great, Outstanding) through to Reminder, Stop and think and Consequence steps for students. In addition to this we have behaviour recordings to track low level and ongoing behaviour incidences across all settings that may result in a detention accumulatively or immediately. Each teacher also engages with a number of incentives and rewards for positive behaviour during their lessons.

As with all behaviour, the cause or root of the issue is always something we will endeavour to reach and we may contact you occasionally to assist us with this process. Discussions with students, supporting their social and emotional development and digging deeper into ongoing issues is the first port of call when a student is distressed or being non-compliant. The following table is a guideline for teachers to maintain consistency of expectations across the school:

5) SCHOOL CHAPLAIN AND THE SPARC PROGRAM

Our School Chaplain, Karen Krahe, has been working two days a week at Ebenezer since the start of 2020. She is non-denominational and does a lot of supportive youth care work with our students.

In addition to being available for 'check-in chats' for students, she also runs a social and emotional wellbeing support program once a week for one or two small groups of per term. SPARC is a program that focuses on the following five key areas:

- Social skills – Building and maintaining healthy relationships
- Purpose – Importance of goal setting
- Awareness – Self regulation, awareness of own/others emotions and how they affect us

- Resilience – The ability to bounce back
- Confidence – Self value and self-esteem building

6) BUS BEHAVIOUR

A number of students use the Busways bus services to get to and from school. It has come to my attention that some students aren't displaying safe behaviours when on the bus, which I have spoken to students and Busways about. It is always important for all students to be safe before, during and after their bus journey and I request that you discuss the safe bus rules with your children if they catch a bus.

Bus Rules for Ebenezer students:

- Listen to the driver
- Walk quietly onto the bus and find a seat
- Once you sit, stay in the one seat
- Sit your legs facing the front
- Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before you get off, get off slowly and safely.

7) UNIFORM POLICY

The wearing of a school uniform by students will assist Ebenezer Public School community in:

- defining an identity for Ebenezer Public School
- developing students' sense of belonging at Ebenezer Public School
- providing an opportunity to build our school spirit
- enhancing the health and safety of students when involved in school activities
- promoting a sense of inclusiveness, non-discrimination and equal opportunity
- reinforcing the perception of the school as an ordered and safe environment

SMS ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS

Once enrolled, students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are required to attend school each day. It is important that students arrive at school and class on time so that they do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day. Each day, teachers mark attendance for every student at 9:00am. Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include illness, having an unavoidable medical appointment, being required to attend a recognised religious holiday, exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

A reminder that our school converted our absence notifications to text messages. If your child is absent from school from this date on you will receive an automatic SMS from the school notifying you of your child's absence and requesting a justification for their absence by return SMS.

Please notify the school office if you have recently changed your mobile phone number to ensure our records are up to date.

All students at Ebenezer PS are to:

MOBILE PHONES AND DEVICES AT SCHOOL

At Ebenezer Public School the safety and privacy of all students, staff and visitors is paramount. This mobile phone policy is supported by other school policies including the school Code of Conduct, School Rules and expectations and the school anti bullying policy. The support of parents/guardians and the school community in implementing this policy is greatly appreciated.

A student may need to have a mobile phone during the school day e.g. safety reasons travelling to and from school. To ensure that mobile phones are **not** being used inappropriately however, please follow these steps:

1. All students carrying mobile phones to and from school are required to leave it switched off at the school office during school hours (including bus lines).
2. If a student is found to be in possession of a mobile phone, their phone will be confiscated, and the student's parents will be advised that a permission note is required before the phone is returned to the student.
3. If a student is found to be in possession of a mobile phone more than once without permission, a detention will be issued.

If there is a message you need to communicate with your child about changes to after school arrangements, please call the school office before 2:45pm and we will pass the message on.

OOSH – OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE

Ebenezer PS has an OOSH (Out of School Hours Care), located near the school hall. OOSH is available for Kindergarten to Year 6 students. Parents of before and after school care children can access the school to drop off and collect their children. An adult is required to physically sign children in and sign out of OOSH. If crossing the road before or after school outside our crossing supervisor times, please hold your child's hand or walk with them across the road.

ROAD SAFETY

We request that parents and students walk to and from school using the road safety guidelines. We have a Pedestrian Crossing Officer who monitors the children's crossing on Sackville Road each morning and afternoon.

Some safety tips:

Children's Crossing-

- Slow down and stop before the stop line if a pedestrian is on or is about to enter the crossing.
- Do not proceed until all pedestrians have left the entire crossing.
- If the road beyond the children's crossing is blocked you must not drive into or stop on the crossing.
- You must not stop in the No Stopping zones either side of the crossing as this blocks vision.
- You must **NOT** conduct u-turns across double lines before or after the crossing.

Walking to school-

- Walking to school is a great way for both you and your children to get some physical activity and stay healthy.
- Remember to set a good example and use pedestrian facilities when available.
- Always hold hands and teach the road safety rules of stop, look, listen and think before crossing the road.

No Stopping zones-

- Do not stop in a No Stopping zone at any time.
- These zones are designed to allow visibility for pedestrians and drivers especially around crossings.

Bus Zones-

- You must not stop within a Bus Zone at any time.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

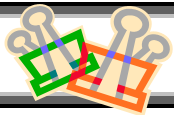
To assist parents and carers completing the '**Moving into Year 7 in a NSW Government School**' form, please note the following:

- **If residing outside our catchment area**, Newtown High School of the Performing Arts has specific enrolment criteria which requires students to audition. Audition information and on-line applications may be found on our school's website.
- Student from **within our local catchment area** who have an interest and talent in one or two of the disciplines are encouraged, although not obliged, to audition for places in our performing arts stream via the online application process which is separate to an Expression of Interest provided to parents from their primary schools.
- The closing date for audition applications online is **Thursday 1 May 2025**.

To be eligible to apply, candidates must be Australian Citizens or holders of a visa granting permanent resident status in Australia on the day of their audition.

Ages Students must be turning between 10 and 19 years of age in 2025.

Cost \$16 to be paid online when registering.

Eligibility The event is inclusive of the following impairments:

- Deaf and Hard of Hearing
- Intellectual – IQ, more significant and autism.
- Physical – Wheelchair / Ambulant
- Transplant recipients
- Vision

Note – Students must have a **formal sporting classification** to trial. However, for students with physical impairment, a letter from a relevant medical specialist outlining the impairment and its impact on their sporting ability may be accepted, as not all physical impairments have access to a formal sporting classification.

General Parent/carer to transport child to/from venue and remain in attendance.

Students may only attend one trial. particular

Students must attend the trial for the Association with which their school is affiliated and complete two games to be considered for selection. If students are unsure which Association they belong to, they can check here: [Find my school's sporting associations.](#)

Scratch scoring – no handicap system or gutter bumpers to be used.

The competition is open to all genders, with no requirement for a certain number of players of a particular gender.

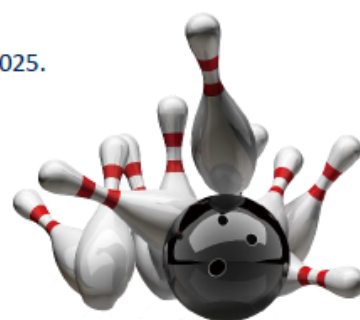
