NSW EduChat is a generative artificial intelligence tool developed and owned by the NSW Department of Education. It supports equitable learning by providing students with safe, secure, and educational access to this technology free of charge.

From Monday, 17 November, students in Years 5 to 8 will have access to EduChat in student mode. Stage 3 students will receive an orientation on how to use EduChat effectively to enhance their learning. Further details will be shared with all Stage 3 families as the rollout date approaches.


