

#### SYDNEY NORTH REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

Between Monday 17th to Thursday 20th February 2025, I was picked to represent the Sydney North Area team in the NSW PSSA Girls Cricket Championships, which was held at Tuggerah.

I played 2 games of cricket per day, with each game having 50 overs. Sydney North was in Pool B.

My main role in the team was being Sydney North's opening bowler, which meant bowling to the other team's best batters. I did get to bat in a couple of games.

On the morning of day 1 we played North Coast and batted first getting 0/165. We then bowled and got North Coast 9/59. In this game I got my first wicket, bowling a batter out!

Afternoon of day 1 we played the Sydney North Invitational team and bowled first. The other team got 9/53 then my team got 1/57 to win. I got another wicket, bowling a batter out.

Day 2 morning we played MacKillop who were one of the strong teams in our Pool. We batted first and unfortunately lost early wickets being 3/14 then 4/29. I got to bat in this game with our team getting 9/107. In my first over I got an opening batter out LBW. MacKillop all out 10/50.

After day 2 we played South Coast. We bowled first with South Coast all out 10/49. Our team got the runs needed with 2/52.

On the morning of day 3 we played Polding and batted first. My team made 1/130 before having to bowl. With a great bunch of bowlers in my team, Polding were all out 10/20. I was involved in a run out.

After 3 days of 30-degree temperature and a lot of cricket, we welcomed the bye in the afternoon on day 3, so we could rest.

Day 4 morning we played Sydney East, and had 4 friends on that other team! Sydney East batted first getting all out 10/25. I was involved in a run out. With rain coming over, our coach instructed us to go out to bat, hit the ball hard and fast because the game was called off early. I batted in this game and watched my partner hit the winning runs.

After 6 games Sydney North was undefeated and top of Pool B! We had made it to the grand final. Unfortunately, rain came down and the umpires called the grand final off. In the meantime, my team had a great time under the tent singing, laughing, chatting, and just having fun. Our team was therefore declared the winner at the presentation. The last time Sydney North girls won was in 2018. Sydney North was lucky enough to get 4 players into the NSW State team.

I am truly very appreciative of the opportunity I got to play in this Sydney North team. I loved playing cricket, but also made lifelong friends and memories from this experience that I simply cannot put into words. Thank you to Mrs Mackenzie, Mr Talevski, Mr Clark for the daily messages of encouragement to my mum, but also to my class who sent me a wonderful video of support on the last day!



## NAPLAN

This year, NAPLAN will take place from Wednesday 12 to Monday 24 March.

Students in Years 3 and 5 are expected to participate in four NAPLAN tests:

- writing
- reading
- conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy

All schools in NSW complete NAPLAN online. However, Year 3 students do the writing test on paper. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the format of the tests before the NAPLAN test window opens.

Please ensure your child has headphones/earphones with a standard audio jack by Monday 10 March. Spare headphones will be available throughout the testing period.

Below is the NAPLAN schedule. There will be opportunities for your child to complete any missed assessments if they are absent from school (within the assessment window). Please contact the school, should you have any questions or concerns.

### **Road Safety around EPS**

We all need to work together to keep our children safe. The busiest times for traffic is 30 minutes before and after school. Students are always learning about the importance of road safety. There are some parents not following the basic road rules. Council Rangers and Local police often patrol the area frequently. We ask that parents continue to obey the road rules around the school to ensure that all student and families remain safe. Fines apply.



School is back! Here are some safety tips for travelling to and from school.

### Safety tips for drop-off and pick-up in the school zone

#### ALWAYS...

- · Remember the 40km/h speed limit.
- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to school.
- · Be aware of pedestrians on or near crossings.
- Be mindful that every pedestrian deserves to be safe.

#### NEVER...

- Call your children across the road. Go to them and help them cross.
- Double park, stop on a footpath, or crossing.
- Do a U-turn or three-point turn in school zones.
- Speed in a school zone. You never know when a pedestrian may step out suddenly.

#### DON'T FORGET

 The No Parking zone is there for everyone to utilise. Don't overstay the limit of two minutes and if it is full when you arrive, do not queue. Drive around the block if need be, until a space is available.




#### Walking or cycling to school in 2025

Walking or cycling to school provides more than just physical benefits.

Congestion, parking and other distractions make the school run stressful for all. Walking or cycling to school is a great way to release stress, interact with your child, and teach them life skills and independence.

- · Identify safe crossing locations.
- Discuss how to spot dangers such as vehicles exiting driveways.
- Show children how to be aware of their surroundings.



STOP! One step back from the kerb.

LOOK! For traffic to your right, left and right again.

LISTEN! For the sounds of approaching traffic.

THINK! Whether it is safe to cross.

Teach your child to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road.



Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child - they will learn from you!

### Parking and traffic rules in school zones

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child, but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. Please choose safety over convenience.

## Lets dive back into February and see what's happening in March at OOSH

During the month of February at the centre, we had Term 1 commence and welcomed everyone back after the holidays.

We welcomed our new kindergarten children as well as some new children who have moved to Ermington. The children seemed excited to come back to OOSH and very quickly have established normal routines.

During morning and afternoon sessions, the older children have been taking initiative with the Kindy's, assisting them with understanding how OOSH runs and offering them opportunities to play. The new children have additionally settled in very well with the existing children helping out to ensure people feel comfortable and safe.

During care periods, we have observed new friendships developing as well as positive interactions with all children during the first few weeks of Term.

Highlighted activities for this month included paper aeroplanes, cubby houses, Oosh kitchen, handball, drawing, board games and playground. 
