### Compulsory school attendance

#### | Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

### What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

### The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

### What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)



Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

#### **Travel**

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

### My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

## What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

- Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

 Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

- Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

### What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

#### **Working in Partnership**

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

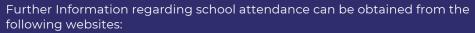

#### RYDE ZONE PSSA ANNOUCEMENT

#### STATEMENT REGARDING 2025 WINTER FINALS SERIES

Due to the excessive rain and subsequent field closures during the 2025 winter PSSA competition, we have lost 7 of the expected 14 rounds: rounds 2,3,9, 11, 12, 13 and likely 14 this week.

After consultation with the participating schools, the Ryde Zone PSSA Executive has decided to cancel the 2025 winter PSSA finals series. During the weeks previously set aside for finals rounds, rounds 2,13 and 14 will be replayed as follows:

	29 August: Round 13replayed 5
П	September:Round 14 replayed 12
П	September: Round2 replayed

These rounds were chosen as rounds 13 and 14 are still in the system and require less administration to complete. The additional round will be round 2, which was the first to be washed out.

Medals will be awarded to the teams coming first on each ladder at the end of the season and ribbons awarded to the teams coming second on each ladder. Medals and ribbons will be distributed to winning schools after the final round.

This decision is permitted under the Constitution, which takes precedence over the General Rules. Clause 13.2 gives the power to the convenors of each sport to make decisions regarding draws. Notwithstanding the authority granted by the Constitution, the Executive sought and received in put from all participating schools as well as the convenors. The overwhelming majority of schools (88.9%) preferred to replay washed out rounds rather than a finals series.

The benefits of replaying rounds include:

- ☐ the ladder becomes fairer than it otherwise would be: hopefully based on 10 rounds instead of 7;and
- ☐ more students are able to participate in sport as scheduled friendlies often dont proceed.

As always, the students are at the fore front of our decisions.



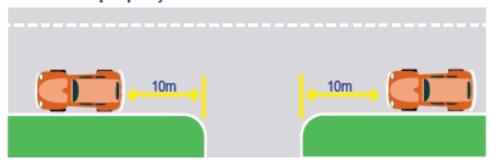

# **Parking Rules**

Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Parking Enforcement Officers and NSW Police enforce parking regulations around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

### You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



Within 10m of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights (20m with traffic lights), unless a sign states you can park there (see image at left).

> PENALTIES & DEMERIT POINTS APPLY

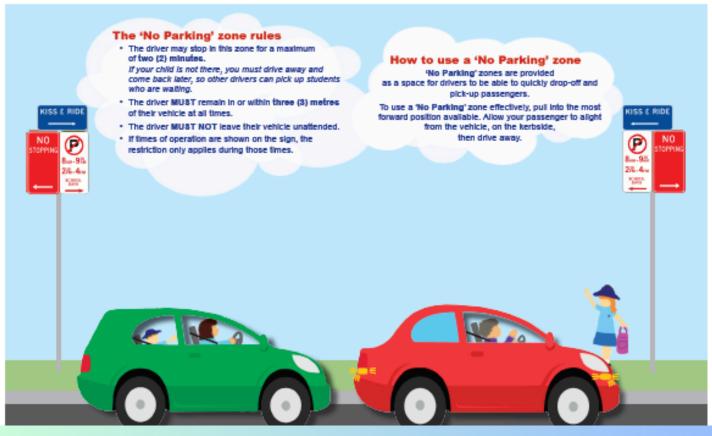
You must park in the same direction of travel and parallel and as close to the kerb as possible.



You can NOT park across driveways or pedestrian kerb ramps. A vehicle can be parked up to the wings on the driveways or ramp (see image)

We kindly remind all parents and guardians that are dropping students off, to be mindful that parking across driveways is a fineable offense. Driveway accessibility is required at all times. 
City of Ryde Libraries would like to invite your students to our Indigenous Literacy Day Aboriginal Storytelling through Art workshop.
