



## Advice from the Department of Education moving into Term 3 2022

While we continue to face challenges, the wellbeing of our staff and students, and our students' education remains paramount. We will continue to implement our layered COVID-smart measures this term, which are aligned to the NSW Government's general community settings, including:

- \*staying home and getting tested if unwell, and only attending school when symptom free
- \*strongly encouraging mask-wearing for all staff and students, particularly in the first 4 weeks of term
- \*Rapid antigen testing for symptomatic students and staff, and close contacts attending school to learn and work
- \*good hygiene practices
- \*maximising natural ventilation
- \*boosted cleaning during the day
- \*responding to local COVID-19 conditions when necessary, by working with the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing team.

#### What's new for Term 3?

- Masks are an effective way of minimising the transmission of respiratory viruses and infections and protecting our community, especially those who are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and flu. We strongly encourage all students and staff wear a mask for the first 4 weeks of Term 3, particularly in indoor settings or when distancing is not possible. Masks remain required for staff who with students at greater risk of serious illness should they contact COVID-19. The latest NSW Health advice also recommends wearing a mask for people who have recovered from COVID-19 and recently completed their 7-day isolation period for an additional 3 days. Additionally, mask wearing is mandatory for staff returning to school as close contacts for 5 school days and strong recommended for primary school students returning to school as close contacts for 5 school days.
- 2. Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs). The department will send another round of RATs to our school early this term. These RATS can be used as required for symptomatic testing, such as if your child is displaying even mild symptoms and daily testing for close contacts returning to school. Once these department-supplied RATS are exhausted, please continue to access store-purchased RATs which are now readily available in the community or PCR tests. Additionally, our school will be maintaining a reserve stock of RATs onsite to support symptomatic testing in the event of an outbreak in our school community. Please also remember that positive RAT results must be registered with ServiceNSW, and students who test positive to COVID-19 must not attend school until their isolation period ends and they are symptom free.
- 3. The rules regarding close contacts in support units/classes and students using assisted transport programs remain unchanged.

We will continue to liaise with NSW Health and the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing Case Management team to ensure our COVID-smart settings keep up with the latest developments. If local conditions required it, this <u>may</u> mean reintroducing temporary additional COVID-smart measure to act as an 'circuit breaker' including

- Mandating mask wearing for all staff
- Postponing or limiting non essential activities like excursions, indoor assemblies and visitors to the school
- Directing cohorts to learn remotely for short periods of time
