

FROM THE DESKS OF OUR APC&Is

A Connectionist Approach to Mathematics

The most current research into the effective teaching of Mathematics shows that effective teachers support connections between different ways of solving problems, between mathematical representations and topics, and between Mathematics and everyday experiences. When teachers emphasise the links between mathematical ideas, it makes new ideas accessible by progressively introducing new ideas that build on their students' understandings.

In our classrooms at EPS, our teachers are providing students with learning experiences that link new learning to students' prior knowledge and this is used as a starting point for students to make connection and build upon what they already know. We also identify the wonderful connections between mathematical ideas and focus areas to teach our students how math concepts are interrelated and interdependent, as well as highlighting the connections between Mathematics and our other Key Learning Areas. Our expert staff also spend a lot of time developing their own knowledge of how mathematical understanding is developed over time, so they can create connections and effectively sequence learning to ensure ideas are developed sequentially across the years of schooling and this term our staff will be focusing on developing our students' understanding of number and place value.

We also focus on developing student reasoning and understanding through the use of classroom talk which is a is a powerful tool for both teaching and learning. Rich, dialogic talk supports students in making sense of complex ideas and builds meaning and understanding of new ideas and concepts.

STAGE ONE NEWS

This week our focus in Stage 1 has been on literacy that can persuade the reader, both literally and inferred. Our story has been "Don't let the pigeon drive the bus". 1H have loved reading this with expression and gusto!. We have learnt to identify persuasive language, to see how punctuation can be used for effect e.g. **NO**!! or no? The children planned and discussed persuasive arguments and how to understand inflection and tone. Then we enhanced our understanding with these amazing illustrations. STAGE TWO NEWS

This term, year 3 and 4 students will learn how to write a speech on a given topic and present it to their class. Students will have help to plan, write and practise their speeches in class time, but are also encouraged to work on this at home as well. This assessment is designed to strengthen students' self-confidence in public speaking, as well as build upon their research skills to gain information to support and elaborate on a point of view. Students will need to justify their personal opinions on a particular topic and consider language choices to entertain, inform or persuade their audiences. Speeches will be delivered in class in week 5.







STAGE THREE NEWS

As part of a Sporting Schools Grant, all Stage 3 classes are participating in a soccer skills program for the first four weeks of this term. The students enjoyed the drills and games that coach Harry shared with them, regardless of their skill level.
