GENERAL INFORMATION

NSW Health Primary School Dental Program

NSW Health is working with the Department of Education and public primary schools to offer free dental check-ups and preventive care, to all students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Our school has been selected to participate in the program.

Many parents may not realise two important things about their children's teeth:

- 1. Good oral health is essential for children to successfully learn and participate at school, and
- 2. NSW Health offers free public dental health services to all children under 18 years of age.

Learning and behaviour difficulties at school can start with tooth and gum problems. That's because decay and gum disease can cause pain and difficulties in eating, sleeping, talking, concentrating, and learning, which can in turn affect a child's behaviour in class. A child with tooth decay may feel self-conscious about the way their teeth look and feel, making it harder for them to join in class and social activities.

Our school is participating in the program and offering students the opportunity to have free dental check-ups in a comfortable and familiar environment at school. With a parent/carers consent, students are able to have a free dental check-up and free preventive care.

The program is scheduled to visit our school from 18/07/2023 to 18/08/2023.

A Parent Information and Consent Pack will be sent home with each student, and includes information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/carers who want their child to receive care are advised to:

- 1. Read all the information provided in the pack.
- 2. Carefully complete all the fields of the consent forms.
- 3. Return the consent forms to the school as soon as possible.

Book Covering Volunteers needed!



Number & Place Value

One of the key mathematical concepts we have been focusing on this term across our school is 'Number & Place Value.' This is the ability to read and write numbers with an understanding that the words and symbols we use represent different quantities or amounts.

One of the key strategies that our teachers use in their classrooms is 'The Magic Triangle' which draws clear links between the quantity or amount represented, the mathematical words and language we use to describe it and how this is represented using symbols. Teachers explicitly teach, model and reinforce these important connections across all years as students' number knowledge develops to allow them to effectively and correctly make, name and record numbers including whole numbers of any size, decimals, percentages and fractions.

Research shows that number sense continues to develop well into the high school years and it underpins the development of all other number knowledge



& skills. This strategy is an important component of our learning and this is why we have a strong focus on developing these skills across all grades at EPS. Throughout Term 2, staff have been reflecting on student data to implement explicit teaching and learning sequences to cater for the needs of individual students in the areas of number & place value.

Over the coming weeks we will be reflecting on our teaching of these concepts this term and the understanding of our students to help inform our teaching as we move into Term 3.
