#### FROM THE DESK OF THE APC&Is

After providing much of the theory about the new curriculum over the previous terms, we thought that you may like to see that theory in action across our K-2 classrooms.

Unlike when most parents were in K-2 classrooms themselves and wrote straight into lined books, our students spend much time working on whiteboards so that they can receive instant feedback and corrections from their teachers and sometimes their peers. Being able to rub things out quickly and re-do a task provides students with a positive experience and cements their new learning for them.

Interactive whiteboards are often used to display real-life concepts so that students can see the relevance to their learning. There is a strong place for flashcards so that our students can quickly recall their sight words and practice their new graphemes (letters) and phonemes (sounds) when using their skills of decoding (reading) to encode (write).

Students are always aware of the intention behind their learning and what it means to be successful within their learning. They will hear their teachers talk about Learning Intentions and Success Criteria.

1T hosted the stage 1 assembly on Friday. The students performed the song 'It's Raining on the Rock".








# **STAGE TWO NEWS**
