## **Curriculum Focus**

It's been a whirlwind of a term so far as we rapidly approach the April school holidays. As part of our ongoing journey of improvement, we are currently undertaking the External Validation process. This is a key component of the NSW Department of Education's School Excellence cycle and provides an opportunity to evaluate our practices, celebrate our successes, and identify areas for future growth.

External Validation involves a thorough review of our school's teaching and learning practices against the School Excellence Framework. We work collaboratively with a panel of our peers throughout this process. As a school, we gather and reflect on evidence of our impact on student learning and wellbeing. This reflection helps us confirm the strengths in our school and define key focus areas where we can refine and innovate our approaches.

The insights gained from External Validation directly inform the development of our new School Excellence Plan, which will guide our direction for the next four years. We are working collaboratively as a staff to ensure that our future planning is aligned with the needs and aspirations of our students, families, and the wider school community.

Our priority is to create engaging learning experiences, foster a safe and inclusive environment, and deliver high-quality teaching so that every student can thrive. We look forward to sharing more about our future plans and achievements as we move forward together.

## Kukuparra News

The K-2 Kukuparra students are making wonderful progress in their learning and have been enjoying a variety of fun and engaging lessons. The kindergarten students have smoothly settled into their routines and are actively participating in all lessons with enthusiasm.

In Mathematics, Year 2 students have been learning to identify and describe polygons, such as triangles, quadrilaterals, pentagons, hexagons, and octagons. They have been classifying 2D shapes based on their attributes and counting the sides and vertices of various polygons. Kindergarten students have been focusing on naming and defining shapes like circles, rectangles, triangles, and squares. They have sorted similar shapes into groups and created representations of each shape using art materials. Additionally, all students have been using geoboards to create regular 2D shapes. In English, the Kindergarten students are making great progress as they explore new letters and sounds each week. They've mastered the letters m, s, and t, and are now beginning to blend these sounds to read simple CVC words. The Year 2 students have been enthusiastically focusing on verbs in their writing, discovering the different types, such as action verbs, saying verbs, relating verbs, and sensing verbs. They've also learned that past tense verbs describe actions that happened in the past, like walked, ran, caught, and rescued.

In PDH, K-2 students have been learning to recognise their own and others' strengths and achievements and how theses can enhance inclusive and respectful relationships. They discussed the following important points: strengths can change over time, everybody is good at something, everybody is unique, and people have different strengths.


