

FAMILY FEEDBACK



Kindergarten News - Page 1

Hello Kindergarten Grown-Ups,

Welcome to our classroom. In our classroom we focus on explicit teaching, kindness, independence and strong routines. Children learn best when they feel safe, supported and know what to expect. We work hard, we practise often, and we celebrate progress every day.

Our classroom team includes Nerilee, our SLSO, who supports student learning, Mrs Watson who teaches Library on Wednesdays and Creative Arts on Thursdays, and of course myself working closely with your children each day.

Daily Routines and Practical Information

School runs from **9:20am to 3:15pm**. If your child arrives after 9:20, grown-ups will need to sign them in at the office. If you need to collect your child early, please sign them out at the office and staff will bring them to you to minimise classroom disruption. Students are welcome to come to school from 8:50 which allows students to have a fun outside play before we begin learning in the classroom.

Please ensure the school always knows **how your child is getting home**. Children may be collected from inside the school, the back gate, or travel home on the bus. Any change to going-home routines must be communicated to the school **before 3:00pm** so we can safely get students to the correct place.

Each day your child needs: a hat, drink bottle, fruit break (cut up in a separate container if possible), lunch, and a spare set of pants, socks and underwear for any mishaps.

We will begin **home reading soon**. At first, parents will record books they read to their child. As reading skills grow, students will bring home books to read to you.

Communication is through **Hero**. Families can report absences, read newsletters, and see photos of learning. Newsletters will be sent **fortnightly**.

Our First Days of Learning

We have had a wonderful start and the children have settled beautifully. They are already showing that they are amazing listeners, and I cannot wait to see how far they will go.

So far, we have been building strong foundations:

We are learning how to hold our pencils correctly using "crab claws," and practising our writing cues — tall man, short man, Jack and Jill, and sideways sideways. These cues help form many letters correctly. We are also learning classroom routines such as using pencil cases, tucking in chairs, lining up safely, and packing away lunch boxes independently.

In science we have begun learning about our **five senses** — taste, touch, smell, hearing and sight — and the body parts that help us use them. Students loved exploring their senses through hands-on learning.

In PDHPE we have learned how to keep our bodies healthy by brushing our teeth for two minutes twice a day, washing our hands properly, and taking care of ourselves.

We have also begun learning **Auslan (sign language)**. Students can now sign toilet, wash, hand, I, love, you, play, hello and thank you. It has been wonderful to see them already using these signs naturally in the classroom.

Behaviour, Routines and Growing Independence

Our classroom is a calm, structured space with high expectations and strong care. We focus on being **kind, safe and respectful**. We practise routines every day because routines help children feel secure and successful.

Kindergarten is tiring. Children are growing their brains every day. After school, quiet time, early nights and calm routines at home help them recharge and be ready to learn again tomorrow.

Looking Ahead

In the coming weeks we will hold a **Meet the Teacher** morning where families can learn more about how our classroom works and how best to support learning at home. I look forward to seeing many of you there.

We are off to a fantastic start. Thank you for trusting me with your children. I am excited for the year ahead and all the learning, growth and joy it will bring.

Welcome back to 2026! Our Year 2/3 class has made a wonderful start to the year already. Over the next two weeks, swimming will take up a big part of our day, so when we are in the classroom, we're focusing on learning the routines that will set us up for success this year. I'm so impressed with how quickly our Year 2 students have settled in—it's allowed us to jump straight into some of the exciting learning ahead!

In English, we've begun exploring the book *Under the Southern Cross*, a familiar favourite for our Year 2 students. This will also lead us beautifully into our HSIE unit, where we will discover more about the Australian continent, its unique symbols, and its amazing flora and fauna.

Maths has been all about sharpening our basic fact facts, especially combinations to 10 and 20. Over the coming weeks, we'll be diving into place value, addition, and subtraction to build a strong foundation.

Home reading and homework will begin in Week 5, right after swimming wraps up. I'm also excited to invite you to our 'Meet the Teacher' morning in Week 5, where I'll share more detailed information about how our classroom runs. For those who can't make it, a handy 'cheat sheet' will be provided.

A warm welcome to our new students and families. Welcome back to our Year 3 students and their families too. Mrs Burns and I are extremely excited for the 2026 school year. We have lots of interesting, investigative, informative and enjoyable lessons and topics to discover. Our Friday class program will follow a similar routine as last year. Again, there will be a **STRONG** focus on Mathematics and English content.

Year 3 students will be jumping straight back in, where they left off last year. Sight words, spelling rules, times tables, fast maths, maths mentals, Signpost Maths, word walls, word lists and one-on-one teacher-student reading -just to name a few! Year 2 students will be introduced to all these new activities and more over the next few weeks.

Throughout Term 1, we are studying our own amazing country, '**Australia**'. Together students will learn about the flora, fauna, states, capital cities, iconic landmarks and currency.


FUN FACT: There are more kangaroos in Australia than there are people!!

Tomorrow Year 2/3 will begin creating an 'Australian' window display for their classroom. The class will read a quirky picture book called, '*The Cocky Who Cried Dingo*' by Yvonne Morrison. Instead of The Boy Who Cried Wolf, it's a cheeky, mischievous Sulphur-crested cockatoo! Cocky loves to play practical jokes on other birds-but when Cocky takes a joke too far, he must find his own way out of trouble. The story covers themes of lying, friendship, and the consequences of actions- with a humorous twist.

During the afternoon Art lesson, students will make cockatoos, from paper plates, which will be displayed on our new classroom window. During Spelling, students will discover that the long 'a' sound can be spelled in different ways - as in baby, whale and chain.

Welcome back families,

It's great to be back teaching at Euston Public School this year. I look forward to working with a fabulous group of students, whom I cannot believe are already in year 5/6.

English:

Class text: Our class text this term is *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, by Roald Dahl. We will use words from the text to enhance vocabulary knowledge. We will read 3 chapters weekly to finish the text by the end of first term.

Writing tasks: Students wrote a creative narrative this week that I will collect as their first writing sample. Many have been read in class and were quite impressive. Hopefully we can share them with you all soon via HERO.


Writing tasks this term will be based around the class text.

Sentence a Day Program:

This week we are looking at simple sentences.

Fluency Reading Text:

Too Many Daves by Dr Seuss. Each week students are given a different text to read daily to practice their fluency. I model the text every Monday and then students are given opportunities to practice and read aloud when they believe they are fluently reading.



Spelling: Students have started the PLD Spelling Program and have been grouped according to their data from their previous test. All students are exposed to all lists every day and activities and dictation reading are completed around their specified groups.

Maths:

This term we begin our East Schools Mathematics Program begin the session with timetables warm up followed by Maths revision slides, and then we finish off with our explicit Teaching plans for each unit.



Our learning intentions this week are;

1. To partition numbers, so that we can understand their value and determine numbers before and after
2. To identify a number when given its expanded form so that we can flexibly partition and reconstruct large numbers.

Geography: This week we started our Geography unit and we will be covering the following outcomes;

People organise and manage places using geographical information &

Aboriginal Cultural Knowledges and Practices that care for Country

HS3-GEO-01 , HS3-ACH-01 , HS3-HIS-01, HS3-DEM-01, HS3-ACH-01, HS3-CWT-01

This week we discussed the importance of maps and their role in history and how they have developed over the years. We completed an Australian map, plotting states, oceans and specific places from each state. We will also be exploring the Atlas and what information can be found inside them. We have also been fortunate enough to have some pretty large and very detailed maps of the World and Australia to hang in our classroom. A part of this program is also looking at town planning and what data is used to ensure communities have what they need to make living easier. We will also explore different types of maps.



Swimming: Swimming Program is off to a good start apart from the hot weather. Students are motivated and ready to learn new skills in the water. Please ensure all students have a water bottle **every day**.
