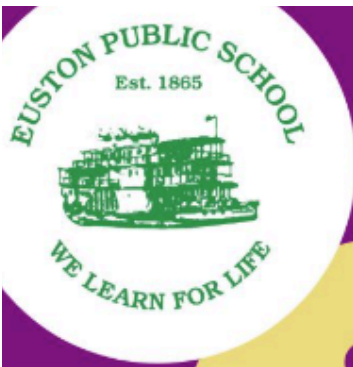
Library

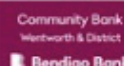

Dear Kinder Grown ups,

Phonics

We've continued to review all the sounds we've learned so far, using them in our spelling and writing to help us become confident, accurate writers. By special request, we also learned about the /oi/ sound this week. **Oi** is used at the beginning or middle of a word (like oil or spoil), while **oy** is used at the end (like toy). This is because English words don't end in i—we change it to a y! Students have enjoyed spotting and sorting words with these spellings in their reading and writing.

World Knowledge - English

We have been reading *All I Want for Christmas is Rain* by Cori Brooke and Megan Forward, a beautiful story that explores context—the idea that where and when a story takes place shapes what happens and why. The story's drought setting has led to thoughtful discussions about how weather impacts people, animals, and communities, especially in rural Australia.

Students will be:

- Identifying and talking about the context of drought and how it affects families.
- Thinking about who children in other parts of the world might ask for help or wishes—beyond Santa!
- Creating their own personal "Christmas wish" and explaining why it's important to them.

We will also be practising writing full sentences, joining ideas with the conjunctions **but** and **because**, and adding adjectives to describe nouns. In art, we will create paintings inspired by the Murray River, showing its connection to floods and to the people and animals who live nearby.

In **Maths**, we've been working on several key skills. Students are comparing and ordering numbers to 100, using hundreds charts to find which numbers are larger or smaller. We've practised counting forwards and backwards to 40 and grouping collections of objects into tens to help with early place value understanding.



We've also revisited number combinations that make 10, using counters and ten frames to show how two groups can add up to ten. When comparing volumes, students have enjoyed using blocks to fill and measure containers, describing them with words like **full**, **empty**, **more**, **less**, and **same**.

Our travels around Australia continue! We learned about the Twelve Apostles—beautiful rock stacks formed by the wind and waves along the Victorian coast—and Cradle Mountain in Tasmania, which is located in a national park. Students were surprised to learn that because Australia is an island, people can only move here by plane or boat—we can't drive from another country!

Next week, we will investigate movement through the air—how an object's shape and material affect how it travels. We will experiment with paper planes and balls to see how forces and air resistance affect motion, helping us link our learning to real-world examples like sports and flight.

As it is nearing the end of the year, I have been reflecting on all the Year 1 students' growth and achievements this year. They have come so far and learnt so much.

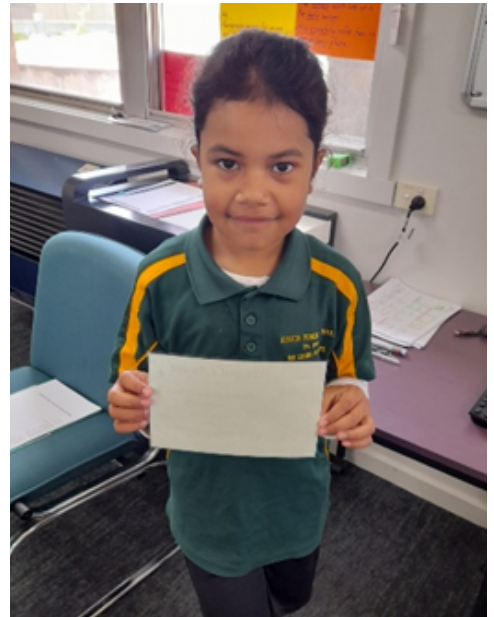

Year 1 had a treat in **science** last week when we had to use our 5 senses to describe uncooked and cooked popcorn. It was a little dry, so we had to have a follow up lesson with some 'sweet dusting' of the popcorn.

Students enjoyed our **tennis clinic** last week. We all learnt some new tennis skills and had heaps of fun. We will continue the clinics each Friday over the next few weeks with Lisa Hill. Maybe we have the next Pat Cash or Ash Barty amongst us.

Thank you those that were able to come and watch our performance during last weeks assembly. It was a whole lot of fun, and we hope you enjoyed it as much as we enjoyed performing for you. This weeks assembly will be the last for the year. Please support Kindergarten and Diabetes Day.

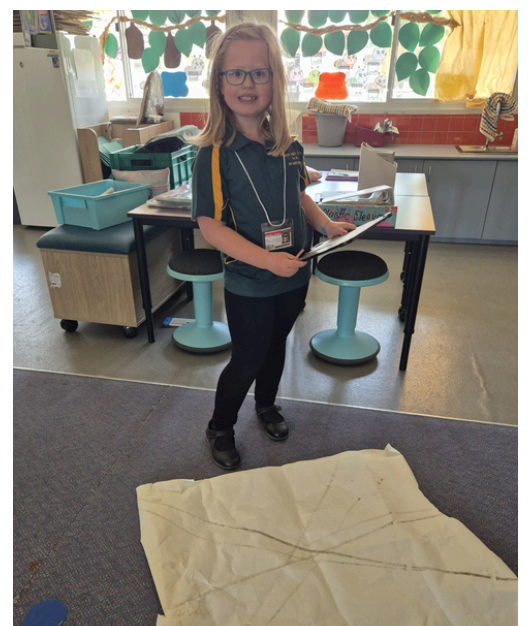
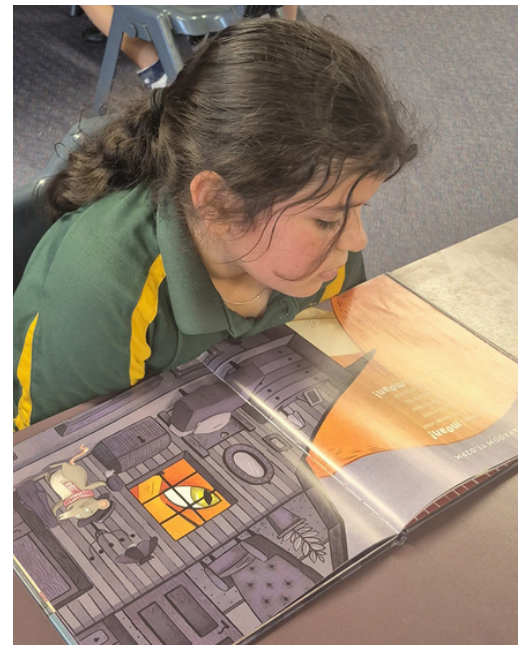

Year 2/3 News - Page 3

Namaste Families,

Where has this Term gone? Blink and you'll miss it!

We are so busy in the Year 2/3 classroom. Striving to achieve our learning goals and to cover as much classroom content as possible, before the end of the year. Alongside prioritising our Maths and English lessons, we have been conducting interesting experiments, participating in tennis clinics, looking fabulous on our dress up days, practicing yoga, studying dental health and producing cool pieces of artwork!

Over the next fortnight our Fridays will look a little like this....

Spelling requires Year 2 to study 'Word Families' (part 4 and 5). Year 3 will learn about 'Comparisons- between two things' (we add 'er' to the word eg. cold=colder). The class will begin reciting our 900th group of sight words for 2025. We aim to achieve the first 1,000 sight words by the end of term, which is exciting and a tremendous effort by students.

During **Mathematics**, the class will be singing the 9x tables. They will also learn fun little strategies, like the finger trick, that can help make the 9x tables approachable. Most of these strategies work up until 10x9.

FUN FACT- Did you know the sum of the digits for each multiple of 9 (until 10x9) always equals 9? eg. 9×2 and $2 \times 9 = 18$ ($1+8=9$) **AMAZING!!** Year 2 will study 'Money', while Year 3 will investigate Chance and Data- possible outcomes, predicting outcomes, also picture graphs, dice graphs and dot plots.

As part of our **Dental Health unit**, students will be making models from egg cartons, blocks, wool, playdough and white paint to demonstrate how important brushing and flossing is to their daily oral health routine. Last week we set up an experiment to see what damage sugar and acid can do to teeth. Students soaked eggs and pieces of chalk (similar mineral composition to actual teeth) in Coca-Cola, O.J, coffee, milk, water and vinegar. Tomorrow we will discover the outcome of our experiment, record the results and let you know our findings in the next newsletter.

It's wonderful to see all the homework, readers and sight words coming in! **Thank you, for your support.**

Hello Friends and Family of Stage 2,

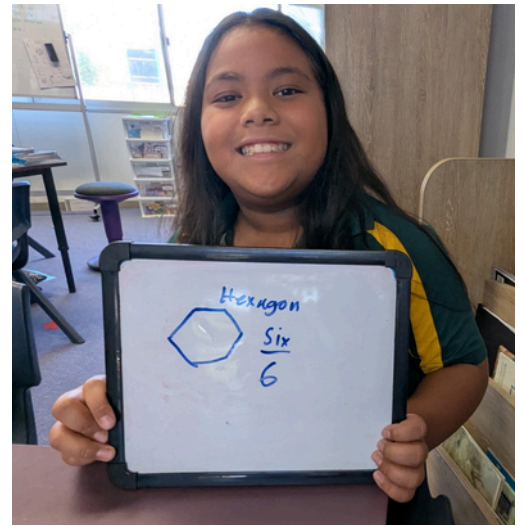
We are officially half way through our final term of 2025!

In the classroom:

During our **English** time this week, we have commenced writing our suspenseful stories after studying our Talk for Writing model text, *The Manor House*. We have been looking at what makes a story suspenseful, focusing on fronted adverbials to build the descriptions in our writing. We are reading the novel *Escape from Marigold Manor* by Rachel Jackson that is a choose your own adventure styled book. We have been enjoying discovering the mysterious adventure of our character and needing to solve clues and choose options to create our story.

In **Mathematics**, we have been reviewing algebraic equations to find the missing numbers. We have been working hard on learning about **2D** shapes and their properties. We have been discovering the properties of both regular and irregular polygons and will be commencing **3D** shapes this week.

We have conducted a lot of **testing** this week. We have completed the South Australian Spelling Test, our Reading and Mathematics PAT tests along with our regular Mathematic Post-Tests. Your students have been amazing at focusing and giving each test their best effort. It is pleasing to see so much growth and I must congratulate them for their hard work this year.

In **Geography**, we have been looking at how Christmas is celebrated in Egypt, The Philippines, Switzerland, Sweden, Germany and Brazil. Year 3/4 students have really engaged in learning about other countries and their traditions, and will complete their own research project into a country of their choice over the next few weeks.

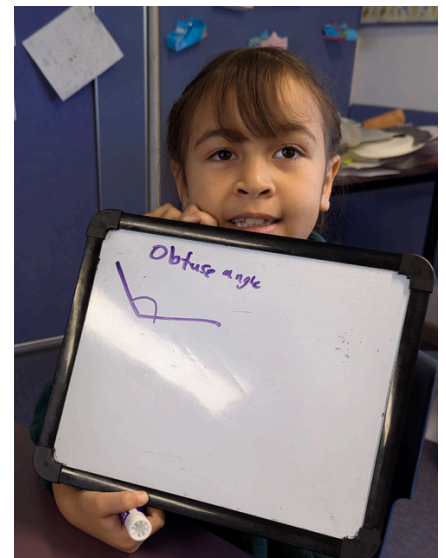
For Sport, we have been doing **tennis lessons** with Lisa Hill. Our students have been giving it a real a go and have been enjoying it immensely.

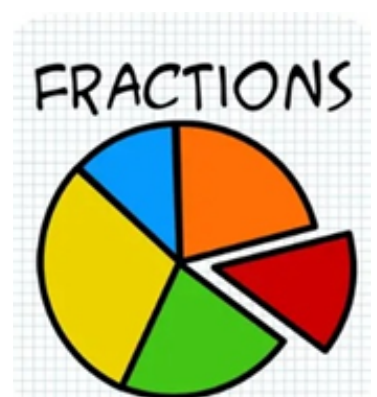


Hi everyone,
Year 5/6 have been exceptional, and have really been working hard every day to get through the units we need to cover before the end of the year. Daily we add new things to the list and the students just handle it like champions.
Over the past two weeks students have completed their PAT testing for Maths and Reading, SA spelling assessments and a few department ones with the support of Mrs Wall, Mrs Hocking, Mrs Watson and myself.
Mrs Hocking also ran a safety session in relation to the 'Safe use of NSW Educhat' at school.

English: This week we finalise our Talk for Writing Program on *Beowulf* and next week will begin our new text entitled, '*Sightings of dragons*'. Pie Corbett outlines a work unit which includes diary entries, persuasive writing, shared writing and a recount. Children are really engaging with introduced texts and are producing some great writing samples which they enjoy sharing with each other.

Thanks to Ms Phillips, I have also introduced a daily sentence program as part of their morning spelling routine, and this has helped students with sentence structure, grammar and punctuation. We also continue to read our class novel, '*The tale of Despereaux*' and complete many activities around this text.

Maths: We complete daily review slides that include a vast array of questions from many units in Maths. This review time allows us to revisit and practice modules that they have already been taught. It also allows me time to see where students are needing more support. This week in Maths we are looking at Chance and next week we look at adding and subtracting fractions.



Year 5 Speeches: Students have been working hard to refine and complete their Captain speeches for 2026. They have had opportunities to practice in front of an audience and have enjoyed making creative voting posters to display in the school grounds. We wish them all the best for next week and hope to see you all there. I also remind students that even if they don't receive a badge, they still have many opportunities to display great leadership in other ways in 2026.



Year 6 Farewell Dinner: Mrs Leslie and I are just finalising the menu and will get notes home to families as soon as this is done. Year 6 students have also been working hard on their farewell speeches for this night, and I can't wait to see them presented. We have had a small meeting about the dinner and students have decided they would like to dress in formal attire.
