
Year 10 Historians Debate the Causes of WWI

Our Year 10 History students recently took part in a debate, stepping into the shoes of key nations involved in the outbreak of World War One. Acting as representatives from Germany, Austria-Hungary, Russia, Serbia, Great Britain, and France, students passionately argued their cases—blaming one nation as the primary instigator while defending their own country's innocence.

The debate was fierce, well-researched, and highly engaging, with students drawing on historical evidence to support their arguments. STEM Visit

On the 1st and 2nd of April Finley High School hosted the Defence STEM team. Students (and staff!) had the opportunity to fly the virtual Blackhawk helicopters and challenged themselves to fly around Sydney, between buildings and under the Harbour Bridge. Some managed this successfully whilst others not so and consequently managed to crash their helicopter and felt the impact through their virtual seats. Students also used virtual reality goggles to learn about the helicopters and some of the physics of flying them. They used the VR equipment to experience riding in a Tiger helicopter that was firing weapons. They further rode on a high mobility rocket launcher and stood on the rocket launcher of a gun line continuously firing shells. Students had an opportunity to speak with the Defence personnel about employment opportunities, experiences in Defence, work experience and much more.

Jesse's career path is a very inspiring one. He left Finley High School in 2013. He turned 18 soon after.

Jesse worked on the harvest and then took a job at Landmark in the Merchandise section where he earned a minimal wage. He decided that that was not where he wanted to work for too long, so he enrolled at La Trobe University in Shepparton to study a bridging course of 4 units, in which he had to gain a score of at least 70%.

Jesse succeeded with his bridging course and then studied in Bendigo for 4 years to earn his Bachelor of Education.

Jesse now works at Mackillop College in Swan Hill where he is a house leader and responsible for 150 students.

Jesse finds his job very challenging at times, but rewarding in so many ways!

His quote to students is "I should have behaved at school, got an ATAR and saved two years of my life!"



Emily Raleigh

Emily completed Year 12 in 2011 at Finley High School. After high school, Em went on to study a Bachelor of Environments, majoring in Construction Management at the University of Melbourne. She worked in construction & property development in both Melbourne and Sydney for a number of years and loved it but spent too much time in the office behind a computer and desk.

"I would have done an apprenticeship to become a builder or gone into the military to become a pilot when I finished school, if that was an option for me at the time. A lot has changed for young women in the last 10 years in terms of our options for careers, particularly coming from a regional area where you don't have as much exposure to all the job options and pathways that exist. Just because you score well in your HSC doesn't meant you have to go to university or do a field of study that your teachers or parents think would suit you"

During Covid, Em trained to become a commercial helicopter pilot and is now pursuing a career in aviation and happily spending a lot more time outside. She is currently flying choppers in the Northern Territory.


