Where are they now?


Sabrina Taylor

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Talent ID day, a ground breaking initiative that offers a unique sporting platform for athletes to be recognised across various sports.

Be part of this event, where Southern Sports Academy is advancing the identification of sporting talent in multiple sports. Those identified from the day will be provided with an invitation to attend the Indigenous Sporting Program held on 20th July and 2nd August. From here athletes may be invited to join the Southern Sports Academy Program Selection Trials in September

WHAT IS TALENT ID?



Talent ID aims to pinpoint individuals with particular skills, personal traits and physical attributes conducive to high-performance athleticism/sports performance.



It encompasses not only assessing physical capabilities but also delves into emotional factors such as attitude, eagerness to learn and resilience.



Emotional qualities vital for success may be trickier to evaluate during a Talent ID day, despite their significance in mainstream sports.

ELIGIBILITY

- The program is open to both male and females 13, 14, 15 or 16 years of age in 2025
- Must be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- Must be endorsed by the school or sporting association you are representing
- You must currently reside or attend school within the Local Government Area (LGA) of the Southern Sports Academy
