### 15s Netball Report

The Riverina under 15's netball carnival was held in Albury on the 14th August. There were 18 teams participating on the day, which were divided into 3 pools. Finley was in Pool A, the results from these scheduled games were as follows; Finley 31 def Junee 1, Finley 25 def Coolamon 6, Finley 24 def Murrumbidgee Griffith 2, Finley 23 def Narrendera 9, Finley 28 def Murray 4.

Due to Finley's strength in these games, the rolling subs promoted various combinations to be developed between the players, and court time shared, allowing all girls to be confident leading into the semi's. The four teams that made the semi's were Albury high defeating Kooringal, and Finley defeating Billabong. The final result of the game was 18-15 in Finley's favour.

Finley's team was led by Captain Ruby N who was relentless with her attack on the ball. She played the majority of the games as Goal Attack, she was key in setting up court play whilst consistently gaining ball back by interceptions or defensive pressure. She combined cohesively with Maisie A in the goal circle. Maisie played the majority of the time as Goal Shooter and was phenomenal. She shot a high percentage of Finley's goals, which was in excess of 90 goals for the day. She shot with confidence and proved havoc for the opposition.

In the mid court Bella R and Ava E alternated between Centre and Wing Attack, both being valued for their balanced, fast release passing. They supported their goal shooters to ensure speedy play within the circle, creating defensive imbalances for the opposition. Adelaide H also contributed in the Centre, Wing Defence and circle defense. Her body positioning to ensure front position resulted in intercepts and deflections. She too was pivotal in carrying the ball through the centre zone. Marlee S was "terrier-like" in Wing Defence. She had hands up over every ball, and created a timely turn over, at a pivotal time in the final. Marlee's positive talk was encouraging to the team and kept spirits high.

Emilee S was inspirational all over the court. She played in both circles and mid court and was unbeatable. The team required her skills as Goal Defense in the final and she created turnovers and rebounded strongly, winning back the ball for her shooters to capitalise. Emmilee is to be commended for her high work rate in all positions played. Maddy P was exceptional at both ends of the court. She combined beautifully in the attacking circle whilst being vigilant in guarding the post defensively. Maddy proved to be flexible in attacking and defending when required. Stella W also played defense. She too created dismay for goal shooters taking intercepts, rebounding strongly and putting defensive pressure over the ball. Stella too, is commended for her ability to play any position, without hesitation.

Unfortunately, the weekend prior to the competition, Addie B was injured in local netball forcing her to withdraw from the team. Addie was selected as a defender and hopefully will be representing Finley High at the State Carnival in November.

The students were well supported by their families. A big thank you for parents coming for the day and being positive. Elyse Price was Finley's umpire, she did a wonderful job and is to be thanked for her efforts.

The girls are now off to the State Finals in Woolongong on the 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> November.

The sit up test was a little easier with the sit ups performed to a specified cadence metre and most of the group succeeded in hitting 50 in the time allowed. Unfortunately, though the students may have seen this differently we ran out of time to complete the beep test. Hopefully though this gave students some ideas of markers they need to meet and has allowed them to set some personal goals for hitting the required targets for Defence testing.


