
It was a wonderful opportunity for the students to see how culture and storytelling can be expressed through dance in such a creative way.

Mínímum Standards Test

It is at this time of year, where each senior students' eligibility for HSC certificate are examined. One requirement is successful completion of the Minimum Standard exams.

All HSC students must pass an online reading, writing, and numeracy test that assesses everyday literacy and maths skills. These Minimum Standards exams are based on the Core Skills Framework. To be eligible for their HSC certificate, students need to achieve Level 3 or above in each test. The online tests are available from Year 10 and can be completed any time up until a student's final HSC exam.

The Minimum Standard Reading online exam is an adaptive forty-five multiple choice questions. It can assess comprehension, spelling, and punctuation skills.

The Minimum Standards Writing online exam provides a choice of narrative/imaginative text or an essay. The question format is usually based on a visual or writing prompt, where the student is required to write a 500-word response to the stimulus.

The Minimum Standards numeracy exam consists of forty-five multiple choice questions. It is adaptive to the students' responses. It can encompass areas such as area, rates and ratios, volume, time, and probability. These are examples only.

Online information is readily available from the NESA site.

Student access to disability provisions is provided as per HSC disability standards. They are for students with permanent conditions, such as vision or hearing loss, temporary conditions, such as broken arm or intermittent conditions, such as back pain when sitting for prolonged periods. The online platform has features that allow manipulation of font size and background colour. Principal determined provisions are also available such as rest breaks, additional time, reader, and scribe. You do not require a diagnosis to access these provisions.

Year 10 students sit their exams during core classes of English, Maths and HSIE. Year 11 and Year 12 students complete the exams during IXL. Students have one attempt per term to pass these exams. Once these exams are successfully completed, by the student, at the required standard, the student no longer needs to sit the exam.









