2/6C presented at the Week 10 assembly, showcasing what they've been learning in their Reading Comprehension lessons. They also performed a beautiful rendition of the song *Inanay*.

Several students shared their favourite Dreamtime stories, including *How the Birds Got Their Colours, The Snake Serpent*, and *The Bat and the Crocodile*.

Jett provided an explanation of the song *Inanay*, telling the audience that it originates from the Yorta Yorta country in Victoria, which is neighbouring the Wiradjuri country.

The song is about the goanna (gugaa), which is a totem of the Wiradjuri people. The Wiradjuri are deeply connected to the gugaa and are responsible for caring for it and its habitat.

The students sang beautifully and did an amazing job!

Why we call upon all of our students to march on ANZAC Day:

Our servicemen and women have left us a splendid heritage. May our successors and we, prove worthy of their sacrifice.

On the morning of 25th April, 1915, Australian and New Zealand troops landed under fire at Gallipoli. It was then and in the battles that followed that the Anzac tradition was formed. On this day, we remember all those who served our nation in times of war. We remember with pride their courage, their compassion and their comradeship. We remember what they accomplished for Australia, and indeed for the freedom of mankind. They adorn our nation's history.

We remember those who fell and served amidst the valleys and ridges of Gallipoli, on the terraced hills of Palestine, in France and Belgium, on the sands of the North African desert, amidst the mountains and olive groves of Greece, Crete and Syria, in the skies over Europe, in Singapore, in the jungles of Malaysia, Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and the Pacific Islands, in Korea and Vietnam, Afghanistan, Iraq and in peacekeeping, in the skies and seas of many parts of the world, and on our own soil.

We remember staunch friends and allies, especially those who fought alongside our servicemen on that first ANZAC Day in 1915.

We gather as a school community to honor the magnificent legacy bestowed upon us by our brave servicemen and women. May both our generation and those to come rise to the challenge and live up to the sacrifice made on our behalf.

- While walking, tune into your senses and observe what you can see, hear and feel. Or you might choose to focus on one of the senses. Eg: Hear: what are all the noises you can hear on your walk?
- On your way home or when you return home, share what each person saw, heard or felt.

Family Habit Builder:

Each night at dinner, ask everyone to take one mouthful of food more mindfully than the rest and think about the flavours they can taste and how it makes them feel. (They can also thank the chef!).

Forbes Public School Project update | April 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

We are delighted to announce classes will resume in Forbes Public School's newly refurbished buildings from Day 1 Term 2.

A huge amount of work has occurred since heavy flooding significantly damaged 11 school buildings in November 2022.

Works that have taken place across Term 1 include:

- resurfacing the main sports court
- replacing 12 air conditioning units
- laying new carpet and laminate flooring
- installing new roof sheeting
- upgrading toilet facilities new toilets, handbasins and partitions
- painting internal and external surfaces.

Students will join teachers and staff for a walk through the new facilities in the coming days.

All learning materials and furniture will be moved before Term 2 begins on Wednesday 30 April. The PA and bell system will also be relocated to the refurbished buildings.

Demountable building removal

Planning for the progressive removal of demountable buildings across the school site during Term 2 is well advanced.

Part of the school oval will be temporarily fenced from Day 1 Term 2 to allow for plant and contractor access to facilitate this work, via Lachlan Street, without disrupting school operations.
