

Stage 1 Excursion – RFDS and NSW RFS

On Wednesday 6 August, 99 excited Stage 1 students, accompanied by 11 staff members, travelled to Dubbo for a day of discovery at the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) and the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Training Academy.

At the RFDS, students learned about the vital work carried out by this life-saving service. They had the unique opportunity to meet both a pilot and a nurse who had personal connections to our school community. Students explored the museum, experimented with pedal-powered radios from the past, and enjoyed hands-on activities using modern interactive displays. A highlight for many was climbing into the pilot and patient seats of the model RFDS plane outside the museum.

The NSW RFS visit offered equally exciting experiences. Students explored three flight simulation rooms — one for practising fire and flood rescues, another for mapping and photographing fires, and a third where pilots train to share airspace with other aircraft. Students watched their teacher don a virtual reality headset to demonstrate the flight simulator. Outside, the children climbed into a real fire truck and discussed how firefighting tools and technology have evolved over time.

It was a day full of learning, curiosity, and appreciation for the incredible work of our emergency services. We thank the volunteers and staff at both the RFDS and NSW RFS for generously sharing their time and expertise, and our own dedicated staff for making this memorable experience possible.

Thank you to all our players for a fantastic year of tennis! Your hard work and dedication have truly shone through. We look forward to building on this experience in the future!




Congratulations Leo
