


# Forbes Public School Newsletter 12th September 2025 Term 3 Week 8

## **Mathematics**

Year 10 Mathematics students learned about trigonometry's real-world applications. They built clinometers to measure angles of elevation and calculated the heights of nearby buildings. This hands-on approach helped them understand practical uses of trigonometry and prepared them for more complex challenges ahead.



# Industrial Technology - Metal

Stage 5 IT-Metal students are busy constructing their own BBQ plates, learning to cut and form metal using hand tools, bench shears, the metalcraft twisting tool, and jigs. They're also gaining hands-on experience with MIG (GMAW) welding, developing their practical skills in metalwork.



# **Biology**

Year 11 Biology students recently conducted a fish dissection to examine the structure and function of fish gills. This practical activity focused on understanding how gills facilitate gas exchange, enabling fish to extract oxygen from water essential for their survival, in alignment with their Biology curriculum outcomes.



## Health and Movement Science

Year 11 HMS students visited Rise Physiotherapy to explore topics such as technology, accessibility, and the essential qualities of physiotherapists. This activity supports their Focus Area One study on "Health in an Australian and Global Context" and will assist the students in their current depth study.
