From the Classrooms

Gold Room - Ms Curnow

Welcome back to Term 3 everyone! I hope you all enjoyed a relaxing and cosy winter holiday break.

We are settling back into our routine for the classroom, and I commend all students on returning back to school with mature and engaged attitudes for learning.

We are beginning the term with some great learning in all areas.

Literacy - we are starting our new literacy unit around informative text types. Our new novel we are studying is Tom Appleby - Convict Boy written by Jackie French.

Maths - we are completing our fractions unit. Students will be learning how to solve problems involving addition and subtraction of fractions with the same or related denominators, using different strategies.

Science - we are moving onto 'The Material World - Chemical Science'. This strand explores the characteristics and observable properties of substances and materials. In this unit students learn that there are three states of matter. They identify different materials as a solid, liquid or gas through engaging interactive and hands-on experiences.

P.D.H.P.E - we will continue to master our 'Fundamental Movement Skills' and sport games (P.E. learning) and students will explore how to build and maintain respectful relationships. Students will expand their understanding of the importance of treating others with kindness, empathy and respect and demonstrate these skills in real-world situations (P.D.H. Learning).

Just a general reminder to please return homework folders on Friday (or earlier in the week is fine too, if that suits you and your child better). Looking forward to a great Term 3!

Green Room - Ms Zuber

We have had a lovely start to Term 3. Mrs Kissel has been in to teach some days whilst I cover some of Ms Twitt's Principal jobs.

This term we will be very busy with our learning.

Reading - we have a lot of new sounds for Kinder and Year 1 students. Kinder students will be bringing home a book now in their homework folders to try and read with you.

Writing - we are focusing on narrative writing this term. We will be working with different mentor texts to learn different features of narratives and what a good narrative looks like.

Maths - we are beginning with multiplication and division with some simple 'groups of' and sharing. Students also have an individual counting goal.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- · year of schooling
- · category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- · level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- · formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- · consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- · develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
