# Spotlight the Literacy Hub



At Gilgai Public School we use our *You Can Do It! Five Keys to Success and Happiness*: Persistence, Getting Along, Confidence, Organisation and Resilience. An extension to our Literacy Hub, the five key concepts are embedded within all aspects of our learning. Students were asked what key/s they are working on in the Literacy Hub:

Phebe: "I am working on all of my keys so I can learn better and learn how to write heaps of sentences."

Tanner: "I am working on my Organisation key because I like to be super organised."
