Late Arrival to School:

Leaving School Early:

Extended Absence:

We encourage families to travel during school holidays. However, if your child needs to travel during the term and will be absent for more than 10 school days, please complete an Application for Extended Leave Form through School Bytes Attendance prior to your travel dates. You will also need to upload a copy of your travel itinerary for the principal's review.

Planned Absence:

For absences lasting from a full day up to 10 days, please submit your request via School Bytes using the attendance tab - planned absence.

Moving Schools

If your child/ren are moving to another school, please send an email to the school advising of your plans. You will need to provide your child's name and class, and the last day of attendance at Girraween Public School. You will also need to provide us with their new school information to ensure that records are kept up to date.



Community Notice

This term, students in Year 1 have continued with our "door-to-floor" routine each morning, beginning our phonics lessons within 60 seconds! We have been learning about the long vowel /oa/ and long vowel /ay/ and how to read and write words quickly and accurately.

During our daily writing sessions, Year 1 students have been introduced to writing a complex sentence. We have also learned all about AUSLAN and the Braille writing system.

During our daily mathematics lessons, Year 1 have had a big focus on making groups with objects and sharing objects into groups! We have even learned how to create multiple arrays.







Term 3 was a busy term for Year 1 events. The highlights for this term were our Dress up Book Parade and The Book Fair, as well as our 100 days of learning celebrations!

Term 3 was a busy and fun term where we learned many new things in different subjects. In English, we worked on sounds called r-controlled vowels like /or/, /er/, and /air/. We also practised tricky spelling words such as "ocean," "muscle," and "yacht." In our writing, we learned how to use adjectives, action verbs, and adverbs ending in -ly.

In Mathematics, we practised adding and subtracting big numbers, rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100, and adding money. We also learned about measuring mass and area, using maps, and describing 3D shapes. We counted in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s and used tally marks to collect and show data with graphs.

In Science, we explored different materials and how they can be changed or combined to make things. We also worked on designing something useful with the materials we learned about. In History, we talked about how families and communities have changed over time and how technology affects people's lives.

In PDHPE, we learned about our feelings and how to get along well with others. We had fun playing games and working as a team during our weekly PE lessons. Our Creative and Performing Arts lessons focused on dance, where we sang, played instruments, and moved to music.

Outside of class, many students joined the Public Speaking competition. The ukulele, dance, and creative games groups also met during lunchtime for extra fun.

Year 2 also started packing up their classrooms in preparation for the big move into our brand new school. You can't get much more exciting than that!

Term 3 was full of learning and exciting activities, and we can't wait for Term 4!






Term 3 has been a fun and exciting time for our Year 5 students, with lots of interesting activities to help with our learning.



K/6S

K-6S have been learning about living things in their science lessons. We know we must use gentle hands and take care of living things. We have been learning that a chick is a baby chicken and comes from an egg and that chickens have feathers. They are soft. In maths, we are learning how to count, how to add two groups together and that shapes are all around us. In English, we are developing our understanding of phonemes and graphemes and beginning to use blending skills when reading words. Our fitness and gross motor skills are coming along in leaps and bounds, as we participate in lots of fun, cooperative, balance and problem-solving activities. We have enjoyed displaying our creative skills through art, craft, painting, cutting, pasting, singing, playing instruments, and listening to big books with puppets. We have enjoyed our community access visit to Central Gardens, learning about the animals and natural and man-made spaces.


