Attendance Guidelines

Late Arrival to School:

Students are expected to arrive at school and be ready to learn by 9:00 am. If your child arrives late for any reason, they must first obtain a late note from the office before joining their class.

Leaving School Early:

To sign your child out early, please visit the office to receive an early slip. We recommend arranging pick-up times outside of break periods. For safety reasons, parents are not permitted to enter the school grounds during breaks and should collect their child at the designated time.

Extended Absence:

We encourage families to travel during school holidays. However, if your child needs to travel during the term and will be absent for more than 10 school days, please complete an Application for Extended Leave Form through School Bytes Attendance prior to your travel dates. You will also need to upload a copy of your travel itinerary for the principal's review.

Planned Absence:

For absences lasting from a full day up to 10 days, please submit your request via School Bytes using the attendance tab - planned absence.

Absence SMS:

If your child is absent or late to school, you will receive an SMS notification. This message will direct you to School Bytes, where you can address any unexplained absences by selecting the "respond" option. Please note that any absence not explained within 7 days will be recorded as an unjustified absence.

Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring our students maintain good attendance!

If your child/ren are moving to another school, please send an email to the school advising of your plans. You will need to provide your child's name and class, and the last day of attendance at Girraween Public School. You will also need to provide us with their new school information to ensure that records are kept up to date.

We are so proud of the way Year 3 have embraced every opportunity and grown both academically and personally this year. Well done, Year 3!





Year 6

Two mornings a week, we meet as a grade for a variety of workout routines and a ten minute run. Students are building their stamina and increasing their fitness every week.







In science we have been learning about simple electrical circuits. 6G enjoyed the challenge of making their light bulb work.
