#### Session 6 - Make a choice

Our Peer Support session in Stronger Together this week provides a series of problem solving and decisionmaking activities to analyse how and why we make the choices we do. It considers aspects of safety and a moral sense of purpose about why we should seek to support others and look more deeply into how our decisions can have a bigger impact than we first thought.

### Session 7 - Standing together

Our Peer Support session in Stronger Together this week looks at the impact of how working together as a team with similar beliefs can provide a barrier to bullying. When everyone is focused on promoting positive behaviours that respect diversity and individual needs, bullying can be reduced. Activities focusing on building teams' strength and awareness of bystanders' responsibilities assist in a whole school approach. Parents and carers could talk with their child about how they could help others who are not experiencing good relationships.



How Much Water Does a Dripping Tap Waste?

Let's break it down:

- A tap that drips once per second can waste over 12,000 litres of water per year.
- If you have multiple leaking taps, that number multiplies quickly.
- Even a slow drip can result in an extra \$50-\$100 per year on your water bill.

Stage 3 students are participating in the Water Efficiency Program (WEP), a collaboration between the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW), our school, and the Environmental Education Centre network (EEC).

Over a semester, students will be supported by an EEC Educator to strengthen the knowledge and skills of students within our school including:


- Learning about water efficiency and our catchment, conducting a water audit of our school and using this information to plan and conduct water efficiency improvements.
- Sharing water efficiency education within our school.
- Communicating water efficiency news and education with the rest of your school community.

Our EEC Educator will visit our school five times over this semester, running activities and supporting our school to develop a Water Saving Action Plan (WSAP).
