






Glenroi Heights Public School Project update | October 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Construction of the new administration and library buildings at Glenroi Heights Public School is progressing well following our previous update in July 2025.

Project overview

The NSW Department of Education is working with key stakeholders as planning continues for works at Glenroi Heights Public School. Work will include the rebuilding of the Administration and Library buildings after they were damaged by fire at the end of 2022.

Progress summary

The concrete slab for the library and administration buildings were poured during the Winter School Holidays and work continued throughout Term 3, 2025:

- **Library building:** The structure and roof of the new library are finished. External brickwork and cladding are still being installed. Work on the building services has commenced such as electrical, hydraulic, and mechanical work. ongoing.
- Administration building: Work on the structural steel frame is progressing and preparations for the next stages of construction are underway.

Next steps

During Term 4, 2025 the following work will take place:


- Administration building: Structural and timber framing and installation are underway.
- **Library building:** Ongoing brickwork and cladding installation, and electrical, hydraulic, and mechanical works are underway.





Managing construction

The construction site will befenced off and inaccessible for the remainder of the school year.

Construction vehicles and equipment, including cranes, cement mixers and jackhammers, willbe used throughout this project.

Work vehicles will enter and exit from Maxwell Avenue with traffic management in place during construction. Deliveries willoccur outside of pick-up and drop-off periods.

Work hours are between 7 amand 6 pm Monday to Friday, and 8 am and 1 pm on Saturday, inline with NSW Environment Protection Authority guidelines.
