Changes To School Report Template and Reporting Expectations

Information regarding Department of Education (DoE) changes to school reports was communicated with the community through School Bytes on Tuesday.

Reporting is a core responsibility of teachers and a key phase of the teaching and learning cycle. The reporting process is one avenue for teachers to reflect on individual and class achievement and can provide clarity on future directions.

The NSW Department of Education has developed a new format in response to feedback from parents and educators, making reports easier to read and understand. From Term Two, Glenwood Public School is introducing an updated school report template in line with the DoE's format. Teacher comments for Years 1 to 6 will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy. Additionally, for Kindergarten reports, the general comment will cover all remaining treated key learning areas, including creative arts, Human Society and Its Environment (geography or history), Personal Development, Health and Physical Education, and science and technology.

Reports will be sent home to families on Friday, 27th June.

Want to be bright? Talk to a 90-year-old

Wednesday is a special day at Whiddon Easton Park Nursing Home, It's the day that children's giggles cut through the air, sticky fingers proudly show off artworks and stories are shared. It's the day the schoolkids come

Twice a week, for the past seven ars, pupils from Glenwood Public School have walked over to the nearby marsing home to visit. their "grand buddles": elderly residents who have become standin grandparents for children at the school, which has a high number of migrant families.

[pupils] families are refugres and don't have that wider family connection due to the fact their grandparents are living in a different country," Glanwood Public School principal Jay McInney said.

"There's wonderful stories of students going and visiting their buildies at Christmas and bringing their whole family. It really is something that is authentic."

"Our children are connecting their time here at school with the real world, that there is purpose beyond the classroom ... They share other people's experiences, they understand things have changed." It's changed the culture of the

school, says teacher Charmaine Harper, who helps run the program. The children are more empathetic and look forward to learning from the elderly.

"A classroom is so isolated from outside the gates," she said. "This gives thom a real experience we often can't give them.

Eight-year-old Tracian Ghirocian can barely contain a smile when he discusses his grand buddy, Christine Wright, whom he shares with mates Isaac Morrison and Jonathon Bateman.

The year 3 boys are working on a biography of their surrogate nanna.
"It's good to talk to her because

I am a guy who really likes to talk," Tracian said, "I can talk away and have no worries about having to stop. I don't like going - I feel kind of sad because I just want to stay and talk more.

"I talk about her life, she tells us about things she has learnt.
"They are connected to history.

They tell us what happened in

previous years. They tell us about

what school was like for them." Wright soid the program was just as exciting for the residents.

"Thave been here for just over a year, and it took me a bit of time to get into going down there, but once I started going I couldn't stop, it was like an addiction," she said.

"You look forward to it. 'Oh, it's Wednesday! Kids will be here today.' It brings an extra feeling to the place."


Attendance Information

As part of the Department of Education and Glenwood Public School's target of increasing student attendance, a new school reward system has been developed to celebrate students' attendance at school. Below are some infographics explaining the school's individual student attendance reward system. Our target is for students to attend school at a minimum of 90% of the time. This equates to missing, at most, 5 days of school per term.

Along with the tracking and rewarding of each student's attendance, classes will also be celebrated each week, with classes that attend at 90% or more being published weekly in the newsletter. A part of their reward will be 10 minutes of technology-based free time.

These new initiatives form part of our whole-school approach to celebrating and emphasising the importance of attending school.


