Semester One Reports

Semester One reports have gone home with students today. Information regarding Department of Education (DoE) changes to school reports has been communicated with the community through School Bytes and in the newsletter over the past weeks.

Families will have a chance to engage with the school's new report format, w.hich sits in line with the Department of Education's updated guidelines.

Additionally, later in this newsletter is a brief from the DoE explaining the new EAL/D (English as an Additional Language or Dialect). This is an optional reporting component that reports upon students who are identified as EAL/D students.

3-Way Learning Conversations

School Audit

School auditing is a systems process to ensure public schools are meeting Department of Education (DoE), government and treasury standards and expectations. All public schools across New South Wales are periodically audited to ensure that finance, Work Health & Safety, child protection, and asset management are being correctly implemented, administered and monitored.

Over the past two days, our school has engaged in this process, which will offer our school an opportunity to evaluate and, if necessary, refine our school practices. This process has been a positive interaction for our school, and I am looking forward to further enhancing our structures and processes to continue to provide a quality educational service for our community.

Written reports for students learning English as an additional language or dialect

Information for parents and carers

Dear parents and carers

You receive two written reports from your child's school each year. These reports will help you understand how your child is progressing and how your school is supporting your child's learning. Each report will show your child's progress in all subjects.

Reports for all English as an additional language or dialect students

If your child is learning English as an additional language or dialect, the report will show your child's progress in learning English language and their current phase of English language proficiency. The phases are beginning, emerging, developing or consolidating. Please see overleaf for descriptions of these phases.

Reports for students in an EAL/D program

If your child is in an EAL/D program they will receive an additional written report from the EAL/D teacher including information about their progress in learning English language.

Reports for newly arrived EAL/D students

If your child is in an EAL/D program and has been in an Australian school for four terms or less, your child's written report will include information about their progress in learning English as well as their progress in the other subjects they are learning as a comment rather than a grade.

Reports for newly arrived EAL/D students in Intensive English Centres or the Intensive English High School

If your child is enrolled in an Intensive English Centre or the Intensive English High School, you will receive a written report about their progress in learning English. In addition the report will show progress in all subjects studied in preparation for high school.

English Language Proficiency Phases						
Beginning	Students at the beginning phase are starting to learn English. They can speak one or more languages other than English and may have an age-appropriate level of written literacy in their first language. These students are starting to engage with simple language tasks of the curriculum.					
Emerging	Students at the emerging phase have a growing knowledge of English. These students can speak one or more languages including basic English, and have a growing knowledge of written English. These students are able to participate in classroom activities and engage with learning when provided with suitable language teaching and additional time to complete classroom activities					
Developing	Students at the developing phase can speak one or more languages, including functional English, and have a developing knowledge of written English. These students are active participants in classroom and school routines, and are able to engage with learning tasks with increasing success. Their first language continues to be a valuable support while they are developing control over English grammar and building their vocabulary.					
Consolidating	Students at the consolidating phase can speak one or more languages, including English and have a sound knowledge of written English. These students are independent participants in classroom and school routines, and have an increased ability to use English to engage in learning with general success. They understand and produce spoken and written texts for a range of specific purposes but still require focused language teaching and strategies supportive of EAL/D learners, as the academic language of subject disciplines increases.					

Telephone Interpreter Service

If you would like more information please contact the school. If you need an interpreter to assist you to contact the school, please call the Telephone Interpreter Service on 131 450 and ask for an interpreter in your language. The interpreter will call the school and will stay on the line to assist with the conversation. You will not be charged for this service.


Attendance Information

As part of the Department of Education and Glenwood Public School's target of increasing student attendance, a new school reward system has been developed to celebrate students' attendance at school. Below are some infographics explaining the school's individual student attendance reward system. Our target is for students to attend school at a minimum of 90% of the time. This equates to missing, at most, 5 days of school per term.

Along with the tracking and rewarding of each student's attendance, classes will also be celebrated each week, with classes that attend at 90% or more being published weekly in the newsletter. A part of their reward will be 10 minutes of technology-based free time.

These new initiatives form part of our whole-school approach to celebrating and emphasising the importance of attending school.

Thank you to Mrs Edwards, our school attendance coordinator, for her tireless effort to devise and implement this new school strategy.


