This ensures that the teacher is prepared and allows the teacher time to prepare for the day and attend to things in the afternoon.

Software Applications

The school uses four third-party online software applications where student details are recorded. All of these companies have been approved by the Department of Education. The school uses Mathletics, Reading Eggs, MathsOnline and Wushka. software applications important tool for supporting learning in the classroom, they have been successfully assessed by the department from a cyber security perspective and the use of the software applications are consistent with the Department Education's of privacy obligations.

Attendance

Goolgowi Public School has high expectations for attendance are. This means a 95% attendance rate, which is 10 days or less absences a year. Let's all work together to ensure all students reach this goal.



Attendance at school is a priority. Regular school is essential for attendance at students to achieve quality life outcomes. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular of attendance students. Parents must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unexplained on the student's record.

Here at Goolgowi Public School we promote high rates of attendance through ensuring that the school is providing quality learning opportunities, it is a safe and welcoming environment, staff are responsive to student needs and are friendly approachable and genuinely care, staff ensure students are engaged and actively participating and are learning and happy.

Road Safety

This term the students in K-6 will be reinforcing their understanding of road safety. The focus will be safety as a pedestrian, safety on wheels and safety in a vehicle. A reminder that the school car park is for staff only.

Congratulations to Charlie Bunn for receiving the Carrathool Shire Council Australia Day Award for Junior Sports Star of the Year. Charlie is a very talented athlete who actively shines in all sports. In Reach Nurse / Wellbeing Nurse and School Counsellor

Mrs Julia Hopp is our school counsellor and Mrs Lisa Brown is the school Wellbeing Nurse. The school counsellor is a teacher with a major in psychology who has responsibility for providing our school with advice and support in matters relating to student academic, personal and social development, welfare and discipline and provides psychological and other testing as required. It is the role of the school counsellor to provide a comprehensive student support program within the school environment offering counselling with students on a one-to-one basis or in a group setting assisting the students with specific issues, acting as a mediator or providing information on other life skills. Mrs Hopp will liaise with parents, teachers, or other external health providers as needed as part of the counselling process.

Wellbeing nurses are employed by NSW Health and co-located in public schools. Wellbeing nurses work closely with school wellbeing and learning and support teams. They also work closely with local health and social services to support students and their families on a wide range of health and wellbeing issues. Issues may include mental health, social and behavioural support, physical health, and peer or family relationships.

Reading Club

The School Reading Club was very successful last year in encouraging students to read regularly at home. Students in Years K-6 will be encouraged to participate in the Reading Club which will start in Week 4. The Reading Club encourages students to read regularly and for those students to be rewarded and acknowledged for their good reading habits. The Reading Club will operate simultaneously with the Premier's Reading Challenge. The key differences between the programs are that the Reading Club encourages reading on a daily basis Premier's Reading Challenge and the encourages students to read a certain number of books. Also, the Premier's Reading Challenge stops in August and the Reading Club continues throughout the year and can continue throughout the school holidays and over the weekend. Each time a student reads for 25 days they will be rewarded at assembly with a bookmark award. Students who read for 250 days in the year will be rewarded with a certificate at the annual Presentation Night and be part of the '250 Club'. The Reading Club folder contains further information with the first 1-25 page. Any questions about the program please see your child's classroom teacher.

Money & Notes Collection

All money and notes should be placed in the grey tin outside the office. Please make sure that all permission notes and money are placed in an envelope that clearly has written on it your child's name and what the money is for on the outside of the envelope. We appreciate your support with this.

Visitors' Sign in at Office

A reminder that all visitors to the school must check in with the school's QR code. This includes everyone, even parents, who enter onto the school grounds between the school hours of 9.00am to 3.00pm. Parents coming to school to pick up their child before 3.00pm, helping out in the classroom for reading or maths, coaching sporting teams at lunch time and on canteen duty are just a few of the examples where parents must sign in.

No Hat, No Play Policy

No hat, no play is a school policy that takes place during the whole school year. It is part of the Department of Education's Sun Smart Policy for School Students.

The aim is for students to be protected from the sun in the early years of their life in the hope that they won't develop skin cancer later on in life. Also, the children are learning the basic skills needed in order to protect themselves from the hot sun.

Students will not be able to play in the sun without a hat and will only be able to play in shaded areas.


You will note that the School Uniform Policy clearly states that the hat is to be a school wide-brimmed hat. This hat protects the



children's face, ears and neck. This policy, and the rest of the school uniform, will be enforced.

Parents Need to Supply Their Child With Sunscreen

Parents will need to ensure that if they wish their child to use sunscreen at school during the week and especially on sport days and swimming, they will need to supply their own sunscreen (labelled with their child's name) and make sure that your child knows how to apply it to themselves. Due to the possibility of reactions and allergies associated with the large variety of different sunscreens from which to choose from, we as a school are not allowed to provide

sunscreen for the students to use. Nor are other students allowed to lend their sunscreen for other students to use.

Also, due to child protection issues, teachers are not allowed to apply sunscreen to students.

To participate in swimming, students will need to have sunscreen and a swimming shirt. This is needed to ensure that the school's H&S responsibilities are covered.

Students will not be able to participate in swimming without them.

Parents really do need to ensure that the wellbeing of their child is of the highest priority. Many students already have sunscreen permanently in their school bag so that they can use it at any time throughout the school day. If you wanted to send in to school a tube of sunscreen for your child to use at any time, it can be kept at school in their classroom.

Change of Student's Travelling Arrangements

A reminder that if you wish your child in the afternoon to travel home a different way to their normal routine you must inform the school beforehand, **preferably by note**. This includes being picked up by another parent or person, going to someone else's place, birthday parties, etc. We are not allowed to let a student go home a different way unless we have parental permission first. It is also not our responsibility to make phone calls to parents who haven't organised things correctly. If we don't have parental child's permission for your travel arrangements to vary, they will be sent home in the normal way.

Picking Up Your Child After School

While students catching the bus or walking home are required to line up in one of three lines near the office. For safety reasons, students are not allowed to wait out at the front gate or outside the school grounds. There are also times when parents are accidentally delayed in the afternoon, and hence it is much safer for the student to be inside the school grounds where they can be properly supervised.

Voluntary School Contribution Fees

Voluntary school contribution fees are \$50.00 per child for the year. **Voluntary** school contributions fees will be invoiced via School Bytes. You can either pay online or in cash at the office.

If anyone needs to, they can speak to the Ms Dayhew confidentially about financial hardship involved in paying the voluntary school contribution fees.


