Remember to ALWAYS hold your child's hand until they are at least 10 years old and closely supervise them around the roads.

ALWAYS hold your child's hand:

- when on the footpath
- when crossing the road or
- when in a car park

Teach your child about being a safe pedestrian! This includes watching out for

driveways, walking facing traffic when there are no footpaths and always Stop, Look, Listen, Think, every time you cross the road.

Avoid distractions and set a good example by putting your phone away. Focus on your surroundings. If you need to use your phone, stop in a safe place.


